RESOLUTION NO. 45.

A RESOLUTION FIXING THE TAX LEVY FOR SINKING FUND PURPOSES FOR THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, ROOSEVELT COUNTY, MONTANA TO MEET OBLIGATIONS DUE AND TO BECOME DUE DURING THE YEAR 1929.

WHEREAS the revenues from the municipal water works of the town of Culbertson are inadequate to pay the interest and indebtedness on said plant and it is necessary in order to create a sinking fund to retire the obligation of said town known as the Refunded Water Bonds and the interest thereon, that a special tax be fixed and levied,-

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

Section 1. That a tax of twenty-four mills on the taxable property of the town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, is hereby fixed, assessed and levied for the year 1929 on each dollar of taxable property within the limits of the said town of Culbertson.

Section 2. That the amount of said tax when collected shall be used for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to retire the bonds known as the Refunded Water Bonds and the interest thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

Section 1. That a tax of ten mills on the taxable property of the town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, is hereby fixed assessed and levied for the year 1929 on each dollar of taxable property within the limits of said town of Culbertson.

Section 2. That the amount of said Tax when collected shall be used for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to retire the bonds to be known as the Funded Debt of the Town of Culbertson, and the interest thereon.
