Special Session. March 7, 1933

Council met in a special session and was called to order by Mayor L.W.Moen.

Said resolution which is set forth hereinafter was then declared adopted by the mayor and his approval thereof expressed at the end by signature as Mayor as shown in these minutes which said resolution thus adopted and approved, reads as follows.;

RESOLUTION NO. 65

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission of Montana is desirous of constructing a section of Federal Highway Route No. 22 within the City of Culbertson and is desirous of routing the traffic on said highway within said city over and upon Hedderich Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission is desirous of receiving Federal Aid for the improvement of said Highway; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Public Roads of the Dept. of Agriculture of the United States of America will not participate in the construction of said highway until and unless the city of Culbertson will agree to refrain from permitting encroachments upon the right of way of said above mentioned street, and until and unless the city of Culbertson will agree to refrain from passing ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit of under 25 miles per hour on said above mentioned street and until and unless the city of Culbertson will agree to refrain from erecting signs, semaphores and signals that will give preference to local routes or that will hinder or delay traffic on said above mentioned street.

WHEREAS, be it resolved by the City Council of the city of Culbertson that, for and in consideration of the State Highway Commission of Montana and the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America constructing said highway and routing traffic on the same within the City of Culbertson over Hedderich Avenue, it hereby agrees with the State Highway Commission and the Bureau of Public Roads that it will not, in the future, permit encroachments on the right of way of said above mentioned street, nor will it pass any ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit on the above mentioned street of under 25 miles per hour, nor will it allow the erection of signs, signs, semaphores or signals that will give preference to local routes which intersect with above mentioned street, nor will it slow up, hinder or delay traffic on the above mentioned street.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

SECTION 1. That a tax of twenty-nine mills on the taxable property of the town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, is hereby fixed, assessed and levied for the year 1933, on each dollar of taxable property within the limits of said town of Culbertson.

Section 2. That the amount of said tax when collected shall be used for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to retire the bonds known as Refunded Water Bonds and the interest thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

SECTION 1. That a tax of fifteen mills on the taxable property of the town of Culbertson, Montana, is hereby fixed and assessed and levied for the year 1933 on each dollar of taxable property within the limits of said town of Culbertson.

SECTION 2. That the amount of said tax when collected shall be used for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to retire the bonds known as the FUNDED DEBT of the town of Culbertson, and the interest thereon.
