The question of permitting Geo. Daniels to keep his cows for a while longer was taken under consideration and it was tabled for a special meeting to be held within a weeks time.

Walter Sheldon appeared before the Council to inquire if they had considered repairing the road to the dump ground also to have the refuse bull dozed into the gully. Mayor Bonebright informed him that action had been taken and as soon as the soil Dist. machine was available it would be repaired.


