Mayor Bonebright again brought up the dog tax ordinance stating he was still of the opinion that it was too high a levy. He called for a vote to amend the ordinance to read Male dogs \$2.00 License and female license 5.00 upon vote for alderman Peterson & Funk against Krall & Sorby being a tie vote the mayor stated he would exercise his rights and vote for the reduction of the licenses.

Vets Club presented a petition for a beer license club to be located over the Smith Retail store upon vote all voted in favor of granting same Alderman Funk refrained from voting. A delegation appeared before the council asking that fire hydrants be placed at four designated spots. Fire chief Mc Kinney agreed that this should be done and asked that 8" hydrants be purchased and placed on vital spots by elevator and main street and that the 4" hydrants be removed from these points and put in at the places designated by the delegation. Clerk was instructed to write for information on hydrants. Howard Mc Kinney complained about the property next to him known as the wedge house stating that weeds have been let to grow and that the toilet was tipped over. Mayor informed him that the town would clean up same. Other complaints were registered about the back of the restaurants and voiced their opinion that they should be made to clean up. Fire chief Mc Kinney informed the council that new houses were built without conforming with the chimney ordinances.

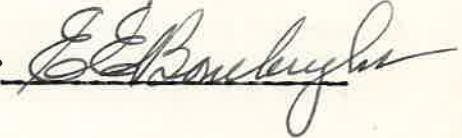

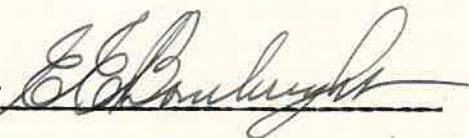
