RESOLUTION NO. 122

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT TO BE THE INTENTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, TO CREATE THE SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4 IN THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARTICIPATING WITH THE MONTANA HIGHWAY COMMISSION IN IMPROVING THAT PORTION OF HIGHWAY NO. 16 SITUATED WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

SECTION 1. That public interest and convenience requires and it is deemed necessary to order and create, and the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana intends to order and create a special improvement district with the number, the boundaries and the character of the improvement to be made as are hereafter set forth.

SECTION 2. It is the intention of the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana to create and establish in said town a special improvement district for the purpose of participating with the Montana Highway Commission in improving that portion of Highway No. 16 situated within the Town limits of Culbertson, Montana, beginning on the easterly edge of the platted portion of the town of Culbertson, and continuing along said Highway 16 to Broadway Street and thence North along Broadway Street to the intersection of Clark Street, and thence North along Clark Street to the junction of U. S. Highway No. 2, and also beginning at the intersection of Highway No. 2 and Charles Street, North along Charles Street a distance of two blocks to the northerly boundary of the South Side Addition to Culbertson, such improvement to include the grading, reconstruction and surfacing of said highway and the installation of curbs and gutters.

SECTION 3. That the number of said special improvement district is hereby designated as "Special Improvement District No. 4 of the Town of Culbertson, Montana".

SECTION 4. It is the opinion of the Town Council of Culbertson, Montana, that such contemplated work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit and that such work and improvement should be chargeable upon an extended district and shall include other lots not fronting on the improvement, and that hereafter set forth are the boundaries of said Special Improvement District and such property within said boundaries is hereby declared to be the district benefited by such work and improvements and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, as follows:

North Side Addition

All lots in Blocks 1, 2, 3, & 4.

Bruegger Addition

All lots in Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16.

Nugent Addition

All lots in Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.

Cushings First Addition

All lots in Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9.

Cushings Second Addition

Lots 1 through 27 inclusive, of Block 1; <sup>thence</sup> Lots 1 to 15 inclusive, of Block 2; All lots in Block 3; Lots 1 to 23 inclusive, of Block 4; plus the South 65 feet of Outlet 1, Block 1.



1 Courchene's Third Addition

2 All Lots of the East Half of Blocks 1 and 2.

3 Original Townsite of Culbertson

4 All Lots of the West Half of Blocks 1 and 2.

20 Great Northern Right-of-Way to a stake on the land, being the SE corner  
21 of the immediately above described tract, thence due West to the point  
22 of beginning; and

23 A tract of land in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 29, Twp. 28 N., Rge. 56 E. M. M.,  
24 beginning at a point 20' South from the SW corner of Lot 1, of Block  
25 16, Bruegger's Addition to the Townsite of Culbertson, Montana, thence  
26 on a projected line of the West boundary line of Block 16 of Bruegger's  
27 Addition, South a distance of 240', thence at right angles to the left  
28 Easterly a distance of 140', thence at right angles to the left northerly  
29 a distance of 100', thence at right angles to the left westerly a  
30 distance of 90', thence at right angles to the right northerly a  
31 distance of 140', thence at right angles to the left westerly a  
32 distance of 50', being the point of beginning.

SECTION 10. That on Monday, the 5th day of May, 1958, at the  
Town Council Chambers in the Town Hall in the Town of Culbertson, Montana,  
at 8:00 P. M., the council of said Town of Culbertson, Montana, intends  
to create said special improvement district and will hear objections  
to the same, at which time and place any person or persons who are owners  
or agents of owners of any lot or parcel of land in said special improve-  
ment district who shall, within fifteen (15) days after the first pub-  
lication of the notice of the passage of this resolution had delivered  
to the Town Clerk of the Town of Culbertson, a protest in writing,  
against the proposed work or improvement, or against the extent or  
creation of the district to be assessed, or both, shall have the right  
to appear at said meeting in person or by counsel and show cause, if  
any there be, why said special improvement district should not be created  
and the improvement herein mentioned should not be made.

SECTION 11. The following notice of the adoption of this resolu-  
tion shall be published in our issue of The SEARCHLIGHT Searchlight, a  
weekly newspaper published in the Town of Culbertson, Montana, said  
notice to be so published on March 27, 1958:



1 SECTION 5. The Town Council hereby finds and determines that all  
2 real estate situated in said district will be especially benefited and  
3 affected by said improvement and the property included within the  
4 boundaries of said district is hereby declared to be the property to  
5 be assessed for the costs and expense of making said improvement.

6 SECTION 6. That the character of the improvements to be made  
7 in said special improvement district is hereby declared to be as  
8 follows:

9 Highway No. 16 along the route described in Section 2 above,  
10 within the limits of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, shall be graded,  
11 reconstructed and surfaced and there shall be installed necessary  
12 curbs and gutters; that such improvements shall be in participation  
13 with the Montana Highway Commission and are to be made in accordance  
14 with the plans and specifications to be prepared by the Montana High-  
15 way Commission.

16 SECTION 7. That the approximate estimate of the cost and expenses  
17 of participating in the construction of said improvements is the sum  
18 of EIGHTEEN THOUSAND and no/100ths (\$18,000.00) DOLLARS for the entire  
19 district.

20 SECTION 8. That all the cost and expense incurred in the con-  
21 struction and making of said improvements shall be paid by special  
22 improvement district bonds with interest coupons attached; such  
23 bonds shall be drawn in substantially the form as provided by law in  
24 such cases, which said bonds shall be drawn against "Special Improve-  
25 ment District Fund No. 4", hereafter to be ordered and created,  
26 and that the entire cost and expense of such improvement shall be paid  
27 by the said Special Improvement District.

28 SECTION 9. That said assessment shall be paid for in annual in-  
29 stallments and are hereby extended over a period of twenty (20) years,  
30 and bear interest at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per  
31 annum from the date of their registration, interest payable annually  
32 on deferred payments; said payments shall constitute a fund to be  
33 known as "Special Improvement District Fund No. 4", and it is  
34 hereby ordered that said Special Improvement District bonds shall be  
35 issued against such fund, the denomination and maturity dates of such  
36 bonds to be fixed by resolution to be hereafter adopted.

37 SECTION 10. That on Monday, the 5th day of May, 1958, at the  
38 Town Council Chambers in the Town Hall in the Town of Culbertson, Montana,  
39 at 8:00 P. M., the council of said Town of Culbertson, Montana, intends  
40 to create said special improvement district and will hear objections  
41 to the same, at which time and place any person or persons who are owners  
42 or agents of owners of any lot or parcel of land in said special improve-  
43 ment district who shall, within fifteen (15) days after the first pub-  
44 lication of the notice of the passage of this resolution has delivered  
45 to the Town Clerk of the Town of Culbertson, a protest in writing,  
46 against the proposed work or improvement, or against the extent or  
47 creation of the district to be assessed, or both, shall have the right  
48 to appear at said meeting in person or by counsel and show cause, if  
49 any there be, why said special improvement district should not be created  
50 and the improvement herein mentioned should not be made.

30 posed work or against the extent or creation of said proposed improve-  
31 ment district, or both, shall have the right to appear at said meeting  
32 in person or by counsel and show cause, if any there be, why the im-  
provements proposed to be made should not be made or why such improve-  
ment district should not be created.
