April 6 Council met in regular session with all members present. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved. A group of Citizens appeared before the council asking what the duties of the police were and when he was on duty, also if the gas company was going to restore the alleys and streets. Mayor Moore explained to the group what was expected of the police and that he felt that there was a growing resentment against law enforcement rather than against the police. As to the gas company they were informed that if the gas company failed to repair the streets the town would and they would be billed accordingly. Helmuth Meissel asked if he could place a trailer on the back of his lot he was told to contact those living in his block and if no opposition to make an application to the town council. Or Bell was hired to maintain the streets at \$2.25 an hour but that he should submit his claim and also get his instructions from the street committee. Atty Rathart stated that he had contacted the Consolidated Gas & Oil about digging a well in the vicinity of the Town of Culbertson Land or drop the lease, he felt that they would dig a well as soon as ownership papers were taken care of. There were several inquires as to when larger items would be picked up by the Garbage hauler, it was decided that the last 5 and first five days of each month would be designated for this purpose. Clerk was authorized to sign students work agreement with Bozemen State College. Bids for fuel oil were opened the following were received. Cont. Oil 14.24¢, Husky 13.98¢ and American Oil Co 14.20¢. Husky Oil was awarded the bid for the next 12 months. Mayor Moore presented the following names for approval of one to serve on the library board. 1st choice Belle Bertino, 2nd Mrs Lyle Sorby and third Mrs Warren Rumsey Mayor to contact them to determine if any one of these would accept the appointment. Mayor Moore told the council he was in favor of retaining Veatch as police, however it was moved by Iverson and seconded by Damm to hold a special meeting April 27 at 8 o'clock to make this decision motion carried. 
