

January 7, 1980

He visited with the county attorney about these tickets and the County Attorney felt they were good tickets. Sanford said there should not have been any plea bargaining in these cases. Kenneth was wanting to know if there would be any health insurance for him. He indicated he had some information concerning this. The pickup tires are in need of replacement. Moved by Gene and seconded by Ray to get two new tires to match the front ones. Motion carried, these to be purchased from Conoco.

The water extension line at the end of the street of Hoffman's is to be checked and valve opened to keep main from freezing. The letter from SCS Richard Iverson was read concerning the north side dike. It is on record.

Mayor Finnicum brought up garbage hauling or pickup and asked the visitors present if there garbage had been pickup regularly and most of them shook their heads in a negative way. After some discussion Arnie moved to withhold \$150.00 from the monthly fee for not picking up as per contract, with the understanding that Mr. McMullen or the person holding the contract meet with the council to negotiate and come up with something agreeable and satisfactory to both parties. Second by Gene. Motion carried

Paul agrees to talk with Mr. McMullen about his operation costs and to set up a meeting for negotiating.

After some discussion on the "Resolution of Intention 79-6A SW" from the County Board of Commissioners, Ray moved to accept said resolution and was second by Oscar. Motion carried.

February 4, 1980

Council met in regular session with all members present. Minutes were read approved. Paul reported that he'd visited with the people living near the proposed Hammer Shop. There were no objections. Representative from Continental Grain, Walt Sheldon was wanting to know if the lines of communications would be kept open for the accessibility of city water for the purpose of expansion to their facilities and would like to have councilmen appointed to meet with their engineers. There could be mutual benefits for both parties.

Vannatta and Skedsvold were appointed.

Roger Ashley, County Extension Agent explained the Rural Water District and the survey underway is nearly completed in the east end of the county.

The minutes of January meeting failed to mention the motion by Gene second by Ray to pay \$1.00 per meter for the feasibility study being done by the Rural Water District. There is some coal severance tax money used for purpose.

Sheriff Carpenter asked if the council had any problems or comments concerning the enforcement officers. No comments. Deputy Sanford was checking foreign plates. Any out of state vehicles being in the state and parked on the streets are required to get in state plates after 30 days. Citations will be issued for violators. Sheriff Carpenter also made mention of the county junk car program. Kenneth reported the pumps problems at the river. The stainless steel shaft has become quite worn. Part of the shaft will be replaced and other parts will be built up. The reservoirs have several leaks and the intake line will have to

be replaced and screen caps to be placed on the outlet line when the ice melts.

Meeting with McMullen to Monday Nite at 7:00 P.M. at the clerks office to discuss expenses. At this time the \$150.00 that had been deducted last month will be discussed. Moved by Gene to accept Willie Kruegers bond. Second by Ray. Motion carried.

Paul to contact Commissioner Harvey and to be invited to our next council meeting. With garbage from Froid, Bainville and the out-laying area coming into our land fill, we would like some relief from the county to dig a pit and to have the road kept open to the dumps. Bricks from the old hotel building are on the sidewalk and these should be removed by the owner.

Permission granted to Victor Helland to bring in a mobile home. Freddie Gangstad would like permission to bring in a windmill tower to be used for his CB antenna. Council thought he should get consent from his neighbors, Halsiede and White.

The plan of several years ago was to put a pump at the back of the fire hall property with gas tanks buried. Some council members felt this would be too costly and their maybe an electrical problem. Moved by Gene to accept ordinance no. #140 by Nemont Cablevision as now written, and to delete everything in its entirety as previously written. Secod by Ray. Motion carried.

Discussion on the property of Bill Finnicum. He is willing to annex into the town but would like some kind of help to get water and sewer to this parcel of land.

Senior citizens Multi-Purpose building was mentioned. Things seem to be at a stand still.

April 7, '80 Council met in regular session with all members present. Minutes were read approved.

Landfill seems to have big problems. Someone had set fire to the Continental Grain pit and has put town garbage in it. Several other fires have been set on the grounds as well. To cover the Continental Grain pit would only cause it to smolder, so it was decided to let it burn out and dig a small pit and use it for the time being. There was a complaint that foul seed was being scattered when hauling from the plant with an open truck box. Mr. Sheldon, representative from Continental Grain said this would be corrected by covering any foul seed that would be hauled in the future. Paul to talk to the fire chief concerning the fires at the dump.

Council went over the five written protests for garbage rate increases. Howard Gobbs gave oral protest and gave several suggestions as to help increase revenue other than rate increases. Vannatta felt that it was not feasible to have someone at the fill to collect for dumping and telling people where to dump. Ray Halvorson moved to adopt Ordinance # 143 to increase garbage rates at \$1.25 per user. Second by Oscar. Motion carried.

Moved by Arnie Skedsvold to increase Kenneth Erdahl's wages another \$50. a month effective April 1st. Second by Gene Vannatta. Motion carried. Mayor also informed Kenneth on the \$5.00 tool allowance, that if it was given as such and inventory would have to be kept. Kenneth said it didn't matter to him and it was decided this \$5.00 a month would be included as wage to avoid inventory.

The second pump at the river to be removed for repair. The water valve at the end of Hoffman's street to be shut off. Daily water tests to be taken. Mr. Sheldon thought Continental Grain Lab. maybe able to help with this.

McMullen asked to be hired to run the county cat to cover at the landfill. It was the consensus of the council to have one of the county heavy equipment operators to do the covering. Permit granted to Victor Helland to bring in a mobile home. The house that is there will be unhooked from all services. Moved by Gene Vannatta to give Dan Heckmun thirty days from today to get the house

moved or torn down and out. Second by Ray Halvorson Motion carried, Deputy Stanford said the recent break ins have been solved. Vannatta reported that True Oil Co. and Petrolane Beta Gas are blaming each other for the need to build a scrubber plant to get natural gas into town.

Curbing the north side was discussed. No petition to the effect of curbing was left with the clerk.

Howard Gobbs request sewer and water service for E 99' of lot 2 blk. 5 of Nugent Addition. Paul to look into the availability.

Moved by Gene to order 12 circular posts for street signs. Second by Ray. Motion carried.

Moved by Arnie Skedsvold to authorize town clerk to attend session in Bozeman in 1981 with cost of school and travel allowance paid by town. Second by Oscar. Motion carried.

Moved by Arnie Skedsvold to have costs on fire pool cabinet by next meeting. Second by Oscar. Motion carried.

Paul to contact Constine Damm to run sweeper thru the summer.

Ray to look into the cost of filling the cracks in the pavement/

Moved by Ray and second by Oscar to have clerk attend the clerk-treasurer meeting in Sidney 4-25-80 and to have her expenses paid. Motion carried.

Employment applications gone over. Those applying for work at the swimm pool were Michele Marchwick and Kelly Bell.

Moved by Gene Vannatta to advertise in the local paper for qualified personnel. Second by Ray. Motion carried.

Much discussion on the land fill. County has promised to bring in equipment to get new pit dug and clean the site. Moved by Vannatta to set a schedule of Tues, Thurs, Sat. & Sun. from 3:00 to 8:00 P.M. to have site opened. To have a Contract with Dan Heckmun to supervise the site for \$100.00 a month. Second by Halvorson Motion carried. Attorney to draw up contract.

The fire hydrant across the street from Hannes Gar Care to be replaced and the new hydrant to be installed at the old hotel bldg on main street. It may need an extension. Measurements to be checked. Maude Schuetze requested permission to move the old bldg. on her property between Swansers and Rod. Schuetzes. Permission granted. Steve Baldwin hired for the summer at \$4.00 an hr. to do mowing, sweeping or streets and where ever needed.

A schedule for street sweeping to be put in the paper. Steve to list owners of vehicles left on the streets that are being sweep and the owners of tree branched overhanging the street. Bruce to pick up list for persona; contact.

With several animals in western N. Dak. with rabies it was suggested to have a rabies clinic. Skedsvold to make contacts with vets. Bill Krall head of the cemetary Assn. says May 17th to be work day at the cemetary. Mayor asked that the city truck and tractor be there. Hospital street in bad shape. Swimming pool and parks are being worked on.

Mike McMullen asked what the dead line date for the <sup>house</sup> near the swimming pool was to get it fixed up. At the Nov. 5th, '79 meeting he was given nine months from that date. This would be Aug. 1st., '80.

Jasper inquired about getting the wrecking ball from Williston to finish the demolotion of the old city hall and fire hall. Kenneth to do this.

Skedsvold asked about the property that was not being cared for around town. What can be done to tidy up these places?

Halvorson said that mix was available now for street repair. It would take about 600 gals of oil at .80¢ a gal. and the truck & distributor would be available, the wages would be \$6.75 an hr. and this would have to be done on Saturdays. The weather as it is now has closed many of the cracks in the street. It was the consensuss of the council to wait until fall.

Tri-State Engineer-Merril Rivinus visited with the council and talked about the many things they could do for the town should the need arise. Fireproof files to be discussed later.

Northern Border Pipe Line has requested water and sewer from the town. Some felt that a meeting with their representative was necessary. After some discussion it was decided to have a meeting at the clerk's office May 8th at 7:00 P.M. to further discuss the multi-purpose bldg and funds to used. At this meeting thye would also discuss Norther Border Pipe Line.

June 2, '80 Council met in regular session with all members present. Minutes were read approved. Bids for advertised building were opened and read by the mayor. Larsen Const. for steel structure 40'x40' \$17,140.00, wood structure \$18,253.00 plus \$1120.00 for insulation. Ellerkamp Construction bid for wood structure 30' x 54' bldg at \$14,944.00 without insulation. Moved by Skedsvold, second by Halvorson to take these bids under advisement. Motion carried. May asked Ellerkamp to present an insulation bid that would comply with the uniform building codes. Supt. of Schools asked to have traffic control at the school and there has been truck traffic around the school. Kenneth to check signs that are on hand. Moved by Gene to install six 15 mile speed signs. Second by Oscar. Motion carried. Mark Ellerkamp would like to use the property behind the old hospital for a neighborhood recreation park for youngsters 8 yrs. and under. This would be for baseball and basketball etc. This could be done as long as there weren't any complaints and this to be a gentlemen's agreement. Moved by Skedsvold second by Olson to buy instrument for checking P.H. and chlorine. Turbidity tests should be taken at the chlorine house. Motion carried. It was brought to the attention ~~of~~ the council, <sup>in a</sup> the speeders that are going up and down main street and around town. Vannatta moved to have



meeting with Carpenter. Second by Oscar. Motion carried, Paul to set up date.

Ed Gannon volunteered to treat water ponds <sup>outside of</sup> around town with <sup>Ray</sup> bifex, an insecticide to control mosquito larva. He estimated 3/50 <sup>at base</sup> at \$24.00 a bag to do the job. Moved by Gene, second by Ray to have town pay for the insecticide and to have Gannon and Dick Iverson apply it. Motion carried.

Mike McMullen wants written permission to claim all salvage at land fill. Moved by Gene, second by Arnie that none of the salvage be hauled back into town. Motion carried. Clerk to look back in minutes as to the oral permission of salvage.

McMullen complains of trees and shrubs in the alleys. McMullen to turn in a list of property owners where trees are overgrown. Discussion of unsightly property in town was discussed. Letters to be written. Attorney doesn't mind getting this done. Cars parked in the streets still are the big problem with street sweeping. It was suggested, a big sign be posted at the post office advising of days and hours that sweeping would be done. Steve to put up the sign.

The cable at the park is to be placed around the park. It was suggested to get two 7' posts with a brace across the top for a gateway.

Moved by Gene to increase Steve's wages \$1.00 per hr., second by Oscar Motion carried. Steve to keep his hrs. down.

Ray mentioned that mix is available for street repair.

Moved by Gene, second by Ray not to rent or loan out any city equipment. Motion carried.

Jim Segars with Continental Grain proposed to the council that Continental Grain would put up a reservoir located next to the town reservoirs and have the town do there pumping. They would pay for the service or let the town use water from this storage. If more storage is not necessary at this time Continental Grain would be willing to help financially with a water treatment plant, if they could get into the town system.

Continental Grain is need of a greater water supply for their fire protection and also need quality water for their boilers. They would use about 1500 gallons daily. Oscar mentioned the Old West Trails feasibility study would be completed within a couple of weeks and suggested we see the out come of this report. It was also suggested that Calogan has a machine to remove silt. Paul to check this out. Kenneth to work on fire hydrant this week.

Jack Hammer and equipment discussed. Moved by Gene, second by Ray The town will not rent or loan out any of their equipment. Motion carried.

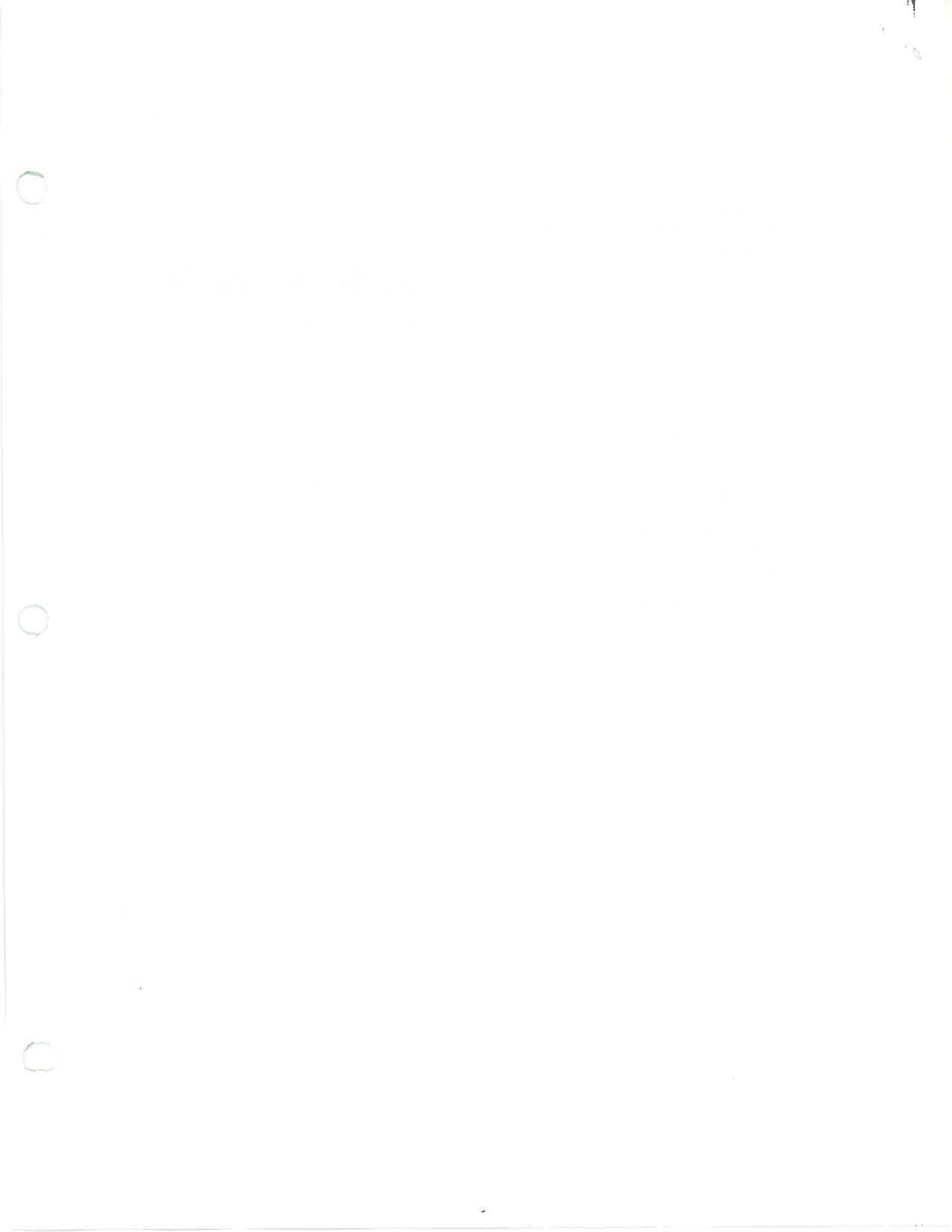

5. In favor of a separate reservoir for the city to pump in the water. No problem as he sees it.

Other discussion:

1. Rate of charge for water for commercial use outside the city limits.
2. Is an additional Feasibility Water Study required?
3. Is it legal for the Town of Culbertson to furnish water for an industry outside the city limits?

City Attorney, Greg Hennessey advised those assembled that by law the Town of Culbertson may sell (a utility) water outside the city limits.

Dick Gluekert specified that Continental Grain wants to work in cooperation with the Town of Culbertson for mutual benefit.

Roger Ashley reported that ~~Mark Johnson and Ken Royce of Bigmark representing the OLD WEST RURAL WATER OFFICE would present a report on the Feasibility Study on Rural Water for Eastern Roosevelt County on July 15th. This meeting will be open to all interested parties.~~ *a preliminary report by July 15*

Walter Sheldon commented on the urgent need for an answer from the Town Council on these questions:

1. Will the Town furnish water to Continental Grain?
2. If so, will the Town pump water into Continental Grain's proposed reservoir?
3. Or, will the Town furnish water to Continental Grain via a tie-in pipeline?

He also pointed out that realistically the Rural Water System could not be functioning in the very near future. But it could be possible that the Town of Culbertson might be asked to help provide water for the rural system because it is already taking water from the most logical source now, the Missouri River.
