Sec. 1. Any person having in his charge any team or single animal or automobile, engine, threshing machine or other vehicle or personal property within the limits of the Town of Culbertson who shall obstruct any crossing or street by halting the same in such a manner as to obstruct the free use of such crossing ~~in~~ or street to exceed fifteen (15) minutes at any one time shall be deemed guilty of violating this ordinance and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$25.00.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 14

RELATING TO PROCESS AND EXECUTION OF SENTENCE.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the town of Culbertson:

Sec. 1. That if any person shall be convicted of a breach, in fraction or violation of any ordinance now or hereafter to be in force in this town and shall not immediately pay the full amount of his or her fine and costs, such person shall be committed to the town jail until such fine and costs are paid or satisfied by such imprisonment at the rate of two dollars per day, provided, no imprisonment shall exceed ninety days for any one offense.

Sec. 2. That every able-bodied male person over the age of ten years who shall be committed to the town jail by virtue of the foregoing section shall be required to work upon the streets, or elsewhere, of the town, under the direction and supervision of the town marshal or his deputy, and any such person refusing to perform any such work may be kept on a bread and water diet for the term of his imprisonment or until he signifies his willingness to do such work.

Sec. 3. In any suit prosecuted under the ordinance of said town, either party demanding a trial by jury, shall before a venire is issued advance the fees of such jury, and judgment shall be rendered in accordance with the verdict of such jury.

chimney or chimney of other fire proof material, and no person or
persons, company or corporation, shall use any stove pipe which passes
through the side or roof of any building hereafter erected within
the fire limits of said Town.

Sec. 2. No person or persons, company or corporation, shall
after the first day of March, 1910 allow any stove pipe used in
place of a chimney to project through the roof or the side of any
building within the fire limits of said Town.

Sec. 3. Any persons or persons, company or corporation who

viction thereof be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00.
