Ordinance No. 21.

Entitled "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO ELECTIONS IN THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON AND PROVIDING FOR THE NOTICE THEREOF."

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Culbertson:

Sec. 1. The annual election for the election of such officers as are by law elective for the Town of Culbertson, shall be held on the first Monday of April in each year.

Sec. 2. The town clerk shall cause notice of all ^{Ordinances} elections to be published in the papers of said town for at least ~~one~~ ^{two} issues, designating the place in each ward where votes will be received, and shall provide suitable ballot boxes as required by law, and shall provide poll books for the use of the judges of election.

Sec. 3. Votes shall be received, counted, returned and canvassed in the manner provided by the political code, so far as the provisions of said code are applicable, and in the election, receiving, filing and disposing of returns, the town clerk shall perform the duties imposed by the Political Code upon the county clerk in like matters.

Sec. 4. Judges and clerks of election shall each be entitled to three dollars for their services.

Sec. 5. Whereas there is no ordinance in force providing for the election in said town in April, 1910, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 27.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF ELECTORS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON." next ensuing, who shall appear before him.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Culbertson:

Sec. 1. On the last, or some preceding, meeting of the council before any general or special election within the town of Culbertson, Montana, there shall be appointed by the mayor, with the consent of the council, some suitable person having the qualifications of an elector to act as registration agent for all precincts within said town. It may be placed thereon upon the presentation of satisfactory

Sec. 2. Hereafter no person shall vote at any annual or special election held in the town of Culbertson unless he shall have been registered in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. On the Thursday next preceding the last Monday preceding the day fixed for the holding of any election, the person selected as registry agent of said town shall meet at some designated place in said town and there attend from one o'clock P. M. until six o'clock P. M. and from seven o'clock P. M. until ten o'clock P. M.

Sec. 4. If such registration agent shall fail to appear and qualify at the time and place above designated, such failure shall cause a vacancy in said office, which vacancy shall be filled forthwith by the mayor by appointment. Before entering upon his duties the registration agent shall take and subscribe the oath of office.

Sec. 5. The registration agent shall proceed and make a registry list of all persons who shall appear before him and show themselves qualified and entitled to vote at the ensuing election in the town, which list, when completed as hereinafter prescribed, shall constitute the registry of electors of said town.

Such list shall be copied from the registry list into books

names of all legally qualified electors in said precinct and all those who will become such on or before the day of the election next ensuing, who shall appear before him.

Sec. 6. When any person shall offer his ballot at any election hereafter held in said town, the judges of election shall examine the registry list, and if his name be found thereon, shall check the same, and shall then receive and deposit his ballot; and the clerk shall enter his name on the poll book furnished as required by the Statutes of Montana. If his name be not found on such registry list it may be placed thereon upon the presentation of satisfactory evidence that he is a legally qualified voter of such precinct. Such evidence shall consist of the affidavit of such applicant and the affidavits of two owners of real property in said town of Culbertson and residents of such precinct, which affidavits shall be substantially in the following form:

"I do solemnly swear that I am a citizen of the United States, ~~or have declared my intention to become such;~~ that I am twenty-one years of age, and have resided in the State of Montana one year immediately preceding this election; that I have resided in the town of Culbertson for three months, and that I am an actual resident of the _____ Ward of said town, and reside at _____".

"We, and each of us, do solemnly swear that we are the owners of real property in the town of Culbertson, and reside in the _____ Ward of said town; that we are personally acquainted with (name of applicant); and that he is to our personal knowledge an actual resident and qualified voter of the _____ Ward of said town; and that we do not make this affidavit upon information and belief, but upon our personal knowledge."

Such affidavit shall be sworn to before any officer authorized to administer oaths, but shall not be made before any judge or clerk of election. The judges shall preserve and file said

Provided that all voters at such elections shall be subject to the provisions of existing laws and ordinances respecting challenges, and the proceedings to be had thereon.

Sec. 7. It shall be the duty of the town clerk, at the town's expense, to furnish for the use of the registration agent a registry book alphabetically arranged, with the requisite columns ruled and properly headed, and a blank oath for the registration agent.

Sec. 8. All proceedings of the registration agent shall be public and open to all persons who may desire to be present; and no name shall be entered upon any registry list except by the registration agent.

Sec. 9. Each registration agent shall receive for his services as such the sum of three dollars per day for each day upon which he sits to register voters.

Sec. 10. No registration agent shall knowingly cause or permit the name of any person not a qualified voter to be placed on any registry list, and no person by swearing falsely cause or procure the name of any person not a qualified voter to be placed on such list.

Sec. 11. Whence an emergency is hereby declared to exist
This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Sec. 1. That the Farmers & Merchantss Bank of Culbertson, Montana, be and the same hereby is designated as the depository of the funds of the town of Culbertson.

Sec. 2. That it shall be the duty of the treasurer of the town of Culbertson to deposit in said depository all funds that shall come into his hands as such treasurer belonging to the town of Culbertson, and to cause such funds to be kept in such depository until they shall be withdrawn by order of the council of said town.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. ~~23~~ 25.

Entitled "An Ordinance abolishing restaurants and lunch counters in connection with saloons within the limits of the Town of Culbertson."

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Culbertson:

Sec. 1. From and after the first day of ~~July~~ ^{August}, 1910, it shall not be lawful for the proprietor of any saloon, or any other person, to keep, maintain, or have on the premises used as a saloon, in the same building as such saloon, any restaurant, lunch counter or other similar arrangement whereby lunches and food is sold or given to the customers of such saloon, nor for the proprietor of such saloon, or any person in his employ, or any other person, to engage in the business of selling or in any other manner giving away or disposing of to any person in said saloon any lunch or provisions of any kind not usually kept for sale in licenced saloons, within the corporate limits of the town of Culbertson.

Sec. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offense.

Sec. 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed.

AVENUE, 98.4.
5. At the southwest corner of Lot Ten (10) of Block Five (5) of the original townsite, 98.4.
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND DESIGNATING THE GRADES OF CERTAIN STREETS AND AVENUES IN THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON.
6. At its intersection with the north boundary line of said Beddick Avenue, being the northwest corner of Lot Twelve (12) of Block Four (4) of the original townsite, 98.6.
7. At its intersection with the north boundary line of said Beddick Avenue, being the northwest corner of Lot Seven (7) of Block Six (6), 98.9.

BE IT ORDAINED: By the Council of the Town of Culbertson.
Section 1.

A datum line or base from which the grades of the several streets and alleys within the Town of Culbertson shall be determined is hereby defined, fixed and designated by reference to the following described bench mark, to wit:

The northeast corner of the top surface of the bottom step of the Farmers & Merchants Bank Building situated on Lot One (1) of Block Ten (10) of the original townsite of Culbertson, is 100 feet above datum.

Section 2.

The grade of the east side of Broadway of the Town of Culbertson along the property line of said street is hereby established at the several points hereinafter designated at the height above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures hereinafter stated, that is to say:

1. At its intersection with the south boundary line of Cowan Avenue, being the northwest corner of said block; 98.7.
2. At the northwest corner of Lot Nine (9) of said Block Six (6); 98.55.
3. At its intersection with the north boundary line of Bruegger Avenue, being the southwest corner of Lot Seven (7) of Block Six (6) of said original townsite, 98.4.
4. At its intersection with the south boundary line of Bruegger

Avenue, 98.4. At the southwest corner of Lot Four (4) of said Block Eleven

(11), 5.3 At the southwest corner of Lot Ten (10), of Block Five (5) of the original townsite, 98.0. At the north boundary line of Hill

6. At its intersection with the north boundary line of Heddrich Avenue, being the southwest corner of Lot Seven (7), of said Block Five (5), 98.9.

The grade of Bruegger Avenue west of Main Street is hereby established at the several points hereinafter designated at the height above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures hereinafter stated, that is to say:

7. At its intersection with the south boundary line of said Heddrich Avenue, being the northwest corner of Lot Twelve (12) of Block Four (4) of the original townsite, 94.6.

8. At the northwest corner of Lot Ten (10) of said Block Four (4), 93.1.

9. At its intersection with the north boundary line of Hill Avenue, being the southwest corner of Lot Seven (7) of Block Four (4), 92.0.

Section 3. The grade on the west boundary line of Broadway in the Town of Culbertson is hereby established at the several points hereinafter designated at the height above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures hereinafter stated, that is to say:

1. At the northeast corner of Lot Three (3) of Block Nine (9) of the original townsite of Culbertson, 99.7.

2. At the southeast corner of Lot Three (3) of said Block Nine (9), 99.65.

3. At its intersection with the north boundary line of Bruegger Avenue, being the southeast corner of said Block Nine (9), 99.5.

4. At its intersection with the south boundary line of said Bruegger Avenue, being the northeast corner of Lot One (1) of Block Ten (10), 99.5.

5. At its intersection with Heddrich Avenue, being the southeast corner of said Block Ten (10), 96.07.

6. At the northeast corner of Lot Four (4) of Block Eleven (11), 94.05.

above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures herein

7. At the southeast corner of Lot Four (4) of said Block Eleven (11), 93.00.

8. At its intersection with the north boundary line of Hill Avenue, being at the southeast corner of said Block Eleven (11), 92.4.

Section 4.

The grade of Bruegger Avenue west of Main Street is hereby established at the several points hereinafter designated at the height above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures hereinafter stated, that is to say:

1. On the south side at its intersection with the west boundary line of Broadway, 99.5.

2. At a point 185 feet due west of the point indicated in subdivision 1 of this section and on the south line of said Bruegger Avenue, 99.8.

3. At its intersection with the east boundary line of Patch Street, being the northwest corner of said Block Ten (10), 99.0.

4. At its intersection with the west boundary line of said Patch Street, being at the northeast corner of Block Thirteen (13), 98.8.

5. At its intersection with Eder Street, being the northwest corner of Block Thirteen (13), 98.5.

6. On the north side of said Bruegger Avenue at the southeast corner of Block Seventeen (17), 98.5.

7. On the north side of Bruegger Avenue at its intersection with the east boundary line of Jail Street, being the southwest corner of lot Seventeen (17), 99.4.

8. At its intersection with the west boundary line of said Jail Street, being at the southeast corner of Block Twenty Two (22), 100.00.

Section 5.

The grade of Jail Street in the Town of Culbertson is hereby established at the several points hereinafter designated at the height

above datum indicated in feet and decimals of a foot by figures herein after stated, that is to say:

1. On the west side thereof at its intersection with the north line of Bruegger Avenue, being at the southeast corner of Block Twenty Two (22), 100.00.

2. On the west side at its intersection with the south line of Cowan Avenue, being at the northeast corner of said Block Twenty Two (22), 102.00.

Section 6.

That the grades designated in the subdivisions of Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this ordinance shall be the grade of the surface of the sidewalks on the property lines at the points therein designated.

That between the points therein designated, the grade shall run in unbroken lines.

All sidewalks hereinafter constructed shall be constructed on grade at the property line and shall have a slope of one fourth inch per foot toward the gutter.

The gutter of ^{all} sidewalks hereinafter constructed of cement or concrete, shall be one foot in depth below top of curb.

Section 7.

All ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 8.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

Sec. 1. That section three (3) of Ordinance No. thirteen (13) of the town of Culbertson, passed and approved November 24, 1909, be amended by adding thereto the following section:

ORDINANCE NO. 28.

Entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A SPECIAL ROAD TAX TO BE USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING THE ROADS, HIGHWAYS, STREETS AND ALLEYS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

Section 1. That every male person, over the age of twenty-one and under the age of forty-five years, residing in the Town of Culbertson shall pay a special road tax of two dollars (\$2.00).

Section 2. That all monies collected under and by virtue of the terms of this ordinance shall be placed in a fund known and designated as the "Road Fund".

Section 3. That said taxes shall be collected in the manner provided by this ordinance for the collection of other taxes, and said tax shall be and constitute a lien against any and all real and personal property belonging to any such persons within the limits of said town.

Section 4. It shall be lawful for any person who is liable to such special tax to work one day upon the roads, streets, highways or alleys of said town, under the direction of the street commissioner of said town, in lieu of the payment of said tax, said one day to consist of nine hours work, but no proxies shall be permitted except by special permission of said street commissioner.

Section 5. That in the event of any person who is not the owner of any real property within said town and who is liable for the payment of said tax, he shall be required to perform such one day's work, or to pay to the Town Treasurer said sum of two dollars on or before the first day of September of each year, and it shall be lawful for the street commissioner of said town to notify any such person the time and place at which he shall appear and perform such work, and in case any such person so notified shall fail to appear and perform such work, or pay said tax, as above provided, then he shall be deemed to have violated this ordinance, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars.

Section 6. That on or before the first day of August of each year it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to submit to the Council of said town a list showing all persons required to pay said special tax, and after the same shall have been approved by the council, the town clerk shall certify to the county treasurer a copy of said list, and it shall be the duty of the county treasurer to collect said tax from the persons liable therefor.

Entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND RESTRAIN THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF ANIMALS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

Section 1. No cattle, geldings, mares, stallions, asses, swine, sheep, or goats, shall be permitted to run at large, or any of such animals to be herded within the corporate limits of the Town of Culbertson, Valley County, Montana.

Section 2. The Town Marshall is hereby declared nominated, elected and constituted, and shall be ex-officio keeper of the town pound, building or inclosure to be used and kept for the impounding of animals, and shall take up, or cause to be taken up, all such animals found to be running at large or herded within the limits of the Town of Culbertson contrary to the First Section of this Ordinance, and confine such animal or animals in such pound, pen, building or other place provided for that purpose; and said Town Marshall shall provide, at his own cost, suitable and necessary feed and sustenance for any such animals so taken up, and the cost of impounding of the same shall be paid to said Town Marshall before such animal shall be released by him.

Section 3. That where any animal, as provided by this ordinance, shall be taken up, it shall be the duty of said Town Marshall upon taking up such animal to immediately notify the owner thereof, in case said owner is known; and said animal shall be delivered to such owner upon his paying to the Town Marshall the costs and charges hereinafter mentioned. If such owner fails or refuses to pay said costs within 24 hours after having received notice of the impounding of the same, or if the owner cannot be found, the impounded animal may be sold at public auction by said Town Marshall at any time after the expiration of six days from the time of impounding the same; and said Town Marshall shall personally attend to the sale of all such animals, and shall give three days previous notice of the time and place of such sale, by causing written notice thereof to be posted in at least three conspicuous places in said town, one of said notices to be posted at said pound, said notice giving a description of the property to be sold, and the time and place of such sale, and a copy of such notice shall be served upon the owner, if he be known, and if such animal be not redeemed before the time of said sale, the said Town Marshall shall sell said animal at public auction as advertised to the highest bidder for cash, and shall deliver to the Town Treasurer of said Town, the excess of monies received, or arising from such sale, after deducting the costs, charges, and expenses allowed by this ordinance, and he shall take a duplicate receipt from said Town Treasurer, one of which he shall file with the Town Clerk.

Section 4. If the owner of any such animal shall apply to and pay to the Town Marshall his fees and charges at any time before the sale of such animal, said Town Marshall shall release such animal. If the owner of any such animal shall apply to said Town Marshall after such animal shall have been sold, and prove ownership thereof to the satisfaction of said Town Marshall before the payment by him to the Town Treasurer, said Town Marshall shall pay the balance due from the sale of such animal to said applicant, taking his receipt therefor, and shall make a written report thereof to the Town Clerk of said Town; and if the owner of any such animal

sold shall apply to the Town Marshal after such payment shall have been made to the Town Treasurer and prove the ownership thereof to the satisfaction of said Town Marshal, the said Town Marshal shall certify such facts to the Mayor and Council of said Town, stating the amount for which the animal was sold, the amount of his costs and fees, and the amount deposited with the Town Treasurer on account of such animal, and thereupon a warrant shall be drawn upon the Treasurer of said Town in favor of said claimant for the amount so certified, and the Town Clerk shall file and preserve the certificate of the Town Marshal with the claimant's receipt thereon, but if said owner shall fail to appear within ninety days after the date of said sale and apply for such amount so deposited in the Town Treasury, it shall be forfeited to said Town.

Section 5. Any person who shall in any manner resist, impede, oppose, delay, hinder, or interfere with said Town Marshal, or any person working under his orders, while engaged in the discharge of his of their duty, in taking up, leading, carrying, or driving any such animal to the Town pound, shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum, not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 6. Any person who shall break open, pull down, destroy or injure the pound in the Town of Culbertson, or any door, gate, fence, or enclosure thereon, or take or attempt to take or drive therefrom or there-out any animal therein impounded without first paying the officer's fees and costs as herein provided shall upon conviction of either thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding \$50.00.

Section 7. Any person who shall permit any dangerous or unruly animal owned or kept by him to go at large in the Town of Culbertson to the danger, annoyance or damage of any person within said Town, shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 8. Any person who shall drive, or entice any animal from beyond the limits of the Town of Culbertson into the same, or shall aid or abet any person in so doing, or shall let any animal out of any enclosure in which it may be confined, or aid or abet any person in so doing in order to take up or impound the same shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 9. The following fees shall be allowed under this ordinance for taking up and placing animals in pound:
For each animal - - - - - \$ 1.00
For sustenance and care furnished each animal per day - .50
For posting notice of sale in each case - - - - - 1.00
For making sale in each case for each animal - - - - - 1.00

Section 10. It shall be unlawful for the Town Marshal to refuse or neglect to take up and impound any such animal known to him to be running at large within the corporate limits of the Town of Culbertson, and in case said Town Marshal shall refuse or neglect to take up and impound any such animal known to him to be running at large within said limits, he shall upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay a penalty of \$5.00 for each offense, together with the costs of suit.

Section 11. The Town Marshal of said Town shall keep a record of all animals impounded, showing the names of the owners, if known, and a brief description of such animal, whether redeemed or sold, and the amount for which redeemed or sold; and shall at the first meeting of the Town Council held in the months of January, April,

July and October of each year submit to such council an itemized statement in writing, showing the entire business of his office as Pound-master for the quarter next preceding the date of such report.
