Ordinance # 52 - made as follows:

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Dubuque:
Section 1. Every Owner, proprietor, manager, or employee of
a pool or billiard hall in the town of Dubuque who
permits a minor under the age of eighteen years to play,
rent, or stop therein is guilty of violation of the
Ordinances of the Town of Dubuque, and this Ordinance,
and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a
fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than
three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment of
not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine
and imprisonment.
