Tax Levy -

Resolution # 31 - A Resolution fixing the Tax levy for General municipal or administrative purposes for the Town of Custarton, County of Ravalli State of Montana for the year 1924, was made as follows:  
"Be it resolved by the council of the Town of Custarton Montana: Sec. 1. That the annual assessment and levy of Taxes for the Town of Custarton, Ravalli County Montana, for General municipal or administrative

purposes for the ensuing year, and the same is hereby fixed, assessed and levied at fifteen (15) mills on each dollar of taxable property within the corporate limits of the town of Cullbertson:

Section 2. That said amount, when collected and paid into the town Treasury of said town of Cullbertson shall be apportioned and distributed as follows; Ten (10) mills to the General Fund, and five (5) mills to the "Special" fund. Motion was made and seconded that Resolution No. 31 be approved and adopted - Motion Carried.

Resolution No. 32. A Resolution fixing the tax levy for Municipal and Administrative purposes for the town of Cullbertson, County of Roosevelt, state of Montana for the year 1924.

Be it resolved by the council of the town of Cullbertson, Montana: Whereas the indebtedness of the town of Cullbertson, Montana exceeds one (1) percent of the assessed value of all taxable property in said town of Cullbertson and it is therefore necessary to levy and fix a Special Tax to defray such municipal and administrative indebtedness as can not be provided for out of the general fund.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the council of the town of Cullbertson, County of Roosevelt, and state of Montana that a special tax be hereby declared and levied for the town of Cullbertson, Montana for the ensuing year, and that said tax be and the same is hereby fixed and assessed and levied at Twenty four (24) mills on each dollar of taxable property within the corporate limits of said town of Cullbertson. And Be It Further Resolved by the council of the town of Cullbertson that the amount of said tax for each of said municipal and administrative purposes is hereby designated as follows:

Nineteen (19) mills to the Water Fund for indebtedness to become due during the ensuing year; Five Mills to be paid into the Sinking Fund of said town, for the redemption of the Water Works Bonds of said town of Cullbertson, and each of said Special taxes when collected shall be used for no other purpose than the expenses incurred as above stated, for the purpose for which said special tax is levied, and not otherwise.
