BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, ROOSEVELT COUNTY, MONTANA:

# SECTION I.

THAT, for convenience, throughout this Ordinance the TOWN OF CULRERTSON, ROOSEVELT COUNTY, MONTANA, is designated and referred to as, THE MUNICIPALITY," and the BOWDOIN UTILITIES CO. is designated by and referred to as "THE GRANTEE". This Ordinance and all the rights, privileges and the franchise thereby granted shall inure to the benefit of, and all obligations of the Grantee shall be binding upon, the successors and assigns of the Grantee herein, the same as if the words "successors and assigns" were repeated after every mention of the Grantee by name or as "The Grantee".

# SECTION II.

THAT the BOWDOIN UTILITIES CO., a corporation, the Grantee, its successors and assigns, be and hereby are granted a franchise to construct, maintain and operate within and adjacent to said Municipality, and upon, in and under its streets, alleys and public grounds as they now are or may hereafter be laid out, within the present and future limits of said Municipality, a distribution system of mains and service pipes, together with any and all apparatus, machinery or equipment, necessary, incidental, or appurtenant thereto for the purpose of distributing natural or artificial gas, or a mixture of both, to the said Municipality and its inhabitants and industries for light, heat and power purposes and any other practical purpose or use, and from time to time to make such alterations and changes in and extensions to the original installation under this franchise as the future growth, development, and requirements of said Municipality, its inhabitants and the industries doing business therein may warrant. For these

purposes the Grantee may enter upon, over, or under any street, avenue, alley or public ground, cross any stream under the control of said Municipality, take up any pavement or sidewalk therein and make any and all excavations necessary for the laying and maintaing of said conduits, mains and pipes, and extending and repairing the same or any part thereof, provided that all construction work shall be done with the least possible inconvenience to the inhabitants thereof. Such sidewalks or pavements shall be replaced or repaired by the Grantee without unnecessary delay and as near as possible in as good condition as they were in before such work was commenced. The said Grantee shall hold the said Municipality free from loss or damage to persons, or property arising from accidents occuring by reason of the construction, installation and maintenance of the said distribution system.

#### SECTION III.

THAT the franchise herein and hereby granted shall continue and be in force for a period of twenty (20) years from the day upon which ordinance shall become effective as herein and by law provided.

# SECTION IV.

THAT the said Grantee shall have the right to charge such rates for gas used for household consumption as may be fixed as fair and reasonable by the proper Body or Commission of the State wherein said Municipality is situated, and exercising competent jurisdiction thereof, and such special rates for gas used for manufacturing, indistrial and power purposes as may be agreed upon by said Grantee and the consumer thereof, with the approval of said Board or Commission.

#### SECTION V.

THAT the said Grantee shall within ninety (90) days after the passage, approval and publication, or posting, of this Ordinance as required by law, file its written acceptance of the terms of the same with the Auditor or Clerk of said Municipality. This ordinance shall thereupon become a binding contract between the said Grantee and the said Municipality. The faithful carrying out of the provisions contemplated by this Ordinance on the part of the said Grantee, and the advantage thereof inuring to the benefit of the said Municipality and its inhabitants shall be considered the reciprocal considerations thereof.

#### SECTION VI.

THAT said Grantee shall have said distribution system in operation within two (2) years from the date of filing its written acceptance of this Ordinance.

#### · SECTION VII.

THAT the Grantee may at any time be relieved of all obligation to render service hereunder upon surrendering to the Municipality the franchise hereby granted and all rights and privileges hereunder, in which event the Grantee shall have two years within which to remove its property, if any, from the streets, alleys and public grounds of the Municipality.

## SECTION VIII.

THAT this Ordinance shall become effective after its passage, approval and publication, or posting, as provided by law.
