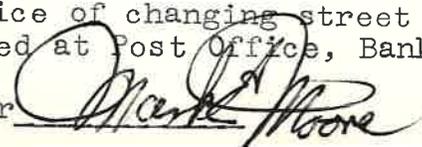

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, DECLARING IT TO BE THE INTENTION OF SAID TOWN COUNCIL TO CREATE SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 5 IN SAID TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXCAVATING, LAYING GRAVEL BASE, PAVING WITH ASPHALTIC MIX, INSTALLING CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER, AND MISCELLANEOUS DRAINAGE ITEMS AND EXTEND AND REPAIR SANITARY SEWER AND WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM, IN AND UPON THE TOWN STREETS AND TO SERVE AND BENEFIT THE PROPERTY HEREINAFTER SET FORTH AND DESCRIBED AND SITUATED WITHIN THE SAID TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA; DESIGNATING THE BOUNDARIES OF SAID PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT; STATING THE GENERAL CHARACTER OF THE IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE THEREIN; STATING THE APPROXIMATE ESTIMATED COST THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HEARING PROTEST AGAINST THE PROPOSED WORK OR AGAINST THE PROPOSED EXTENT OR CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT TO BE ASSESSED OR BOTH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

SECTION 1. That whereas public interest and convenience require, and it is deemed necessary to order and create a Special Improvement District for the purpose of excavating, laying gravel base, paving with asphaltic mix, installing concrete curb and gutter, in and upon the city streets, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, does hereby declare its intention to so create a Special Improvement District, the boundaries of which and the character of the improvements to be made therein are as hereinafter set forth;

angles to Brögger Street a distance of 136 feet; thence easterly at a right angle 132 feet to the west line of Lot Twenty-Three (23) of Block Four (4) of Cushings Second Addition; thence southerly and along said west line of Lot Twenty-Three (23) a distance of 90 feet to the south line of the alley in Block Four (4) of said Cushings Second Addition; thence easterly along said south alley line a distance of 125 feet to the northeast corner of Lot Thirteen (13) of Block Four (4) of said Cushings Second Addition; thence at a right angle and southerly along the east line of said Lot Thirteen (13) a distance of 180 feet more or less to the south line of Section Twenty-Nine (29); thence a distance of 1125 feet more or less to the southeast corner of Lot Seven (7) of Block Twelve (12) of the Original Town--site of Culbertson, Montana; thence southerly along the west alley line extended of said Block Twelve (12) a distance of 221 feet to a point 140 feet distant from the south line of Hill Avenue; thence at a right angle, and 140 feet distant from, and parallel to the said south line of Hill Avenue a distance of 1360 feet more or less to a point 140 feet easterly from and at right angle to the east line of Nugent Street; thence north and 140 feet distant from, and parallel to the east line of Nugent Street a distance of 517.4 feet more or less to the south right-of-way line of State Highway #16; thence westerly along the said south right-of-way line 148 feet to the east line of Nugent Street; thence north along the said east line of Nugent Street a distance of 570 feet more or less to a point 300 feet south of the southwest corner of Lot One (1), Block Sixteen (16) of Brueggers Addition; thence east 100 feet; thence north 280 feet to the south alley line of said Block Sixteen (16); thence at a right angle and east along said south alley line of Block Sixteen (16), Fifteen (15) and Fourteen (14) of said Brueggers Addition a distance of 976.1 feet to the east line of Hugo Street; thence at a right angle and north along the said east line of Hugo Street a distance of 90 feet; thence at a right angle and east 150 feet; thence at a right angle and north 206 feet; thence at a right angle and west 150 feet; thence at a right angle and north 160 feet; thence at a right angle and east 150 feet to the east line of Block Twelve (12) of said Brueggers Addition; thence north along the east line of said Brueggers Addition 662 feet to the north line of the alley of said Block Four (4); thence west along the said north alley line a distance of 1221 feet to a point 20 feet north of the northwest corner of Lot Twelve (12) of Block One (1) of said Brueggers Addition; thence at a right angle and north a distance of 206 feet; thence at a right angle and west 765 feet to the centerline of Charles Street; thence at a right angle and south along the centerline of Charles Street a distance of 765 feet to the centerline of U.S. Highway #2 as it now exists; thence at a right angle and west along the centerline of said U.S. Highway #2 a distance of 619 feet more or less to the centerline of Patch Street; thence at a right angle and north along the centerline of Patch Street a distance of 263 feet to a point; thence west 192 feet; thence south 110 feet to a point on the north line of Blocks One (1), Six (6) and Seven (7) of said Cushings Addition a distance of 702 feet more or less to the point of beginning.

all of which said Lots and pieces or parcels of land are the real estate and property situated and included within the boundaries of said proposed Special Improvement District No. 5, and the Town Council hereby finds and determines that all of said hereinabove described lots and parcels of land, will be specifically benefited and affected by said proposed improvements;

SECTION 4. That the general character of the proposed improvements to be made in said proposed Special Improvement District No. 5 are hereby declared to be as follows:

The pavement consisting of roadway excavation, subgrade compaction, asphalt concrete base and wearing course, excess gravel for base, A.C. for hot mix, seal oil, dilute emulsion fog coat, seal aggregate, straight curb and gutter, circular curb and gutter, curb and gutter removal where the same exists, 8 inch valley gutters, 6 inch alley driveways, 4 inch sidewalk in some areas as replacement and as is necessary to join curbs with existing sidewalk, removal of some existing sidewalk when necessary, miscellaneous drainage items, adjustment of existing manholes and adjustment of valve boxes, extend and repair sanitary sewer and water distribution system. The paving above consists of curb gutters and asphalt paving on streets within the Special Improvement District No. 5.

SECTION 5. That the approximate estimate of the cost of making and constructing said improvements to include the materials required and engineering and supervisory costs, is the sum of \$497,000.00.

SECTION 6. That it is the intention of the Town Council of the said Town of Culbertson, Montana, that all costs and expenses incurred in the construction of making said improvements shall be paid by Special Improvement District bonds with interest bearing coupons attached; such bonds shall be drawn substantially in the form as provided by law in such cases, which bonds shall be drawn against Special Improvement District No. 5, hereinafter to be ordered and created; that the entire cost and expense of said proposed improvements shall be paid by said proposed Special Improvement District and each lot and parcel of land within such district shall be assessed for that part of the whole cost which its area bears to the area of the entire district exclusive of streets, avenues, alleys and public places. All parks, streets, and alleys, and land owned by the United States Government, shall be excluded from the land to be assessed. Said assessments shall be paid for in twenty annual installments with the privilege of each property owner to pay the amount of his assessment within twenty years from the time of the completion of said proposed work and improvements at any time, said installments to be spread and extended over a period of twenty years, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum from the date of their registration, interest to be paid annually on deferred payments, and said payments shall constitute a fund to be known as "Special Improvement District No. 5 Fund" and it is intended that Special Improvement District Bonds shall be issued against such fund, the denomination and maturity dates of such bonds and warrants to be fixed by resolution to be hereinafter adopted.

SECTION 7. That at any time within fifteen (15) days after the date of the publication of the notice of the passage of this resolution, any owner of property liable to be assessed for said work, may make written protest against the proposed work or against the extent or creation of the district to be assessed or both. Such protest must be in writing and be delivered to the Clerk of the Town Council not later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. of the last day within said fifteen day period, and said clerk shall endorse thereon the date and hour of its receipt by him; and that said protests at their regular meeting thereof to be held on the 6th day of January, 1969, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of said day at the Council Chambers of the Town Hall of said Town of Culbertson, Montana.

SECTION 8. Upon the passing of this resolution the Town Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the passage and adoption of this resolution by publication in one issue of The Searchlight, a weekly newspaper published in said Town of Culbertson, Montana, and to post said notice in three public places in said Town of Culbertson at least fifteen (15) days prior to the 6th day of January, 1969, which notice shall be in the form and manner as hereinafter set forth, and further, said Clerk is hereby directed to mail a copy of said notice to every person, firm or corporation, or the agent of such person, firm or corporation, having property within the proposed district at his last known address upon the same day such notice is published and posted.

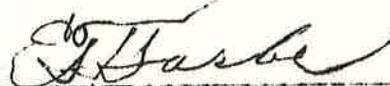
