RESOLUTION NO. 190.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, ANNEXING AND TO EXTEND ITS BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE PARCEL OF LAND BELOW DESCRIBED KNOWN AS THE ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL TRACT.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

Section 1: On Mary 1, 1978, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, declared that it was in the best interest of the town and the inhabitants there of and of the inhabitants of any contiguous tracts that the boundaries of the Town of Culbertson be extended to include the tract described as:

A tract of land in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$), of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Twenty-eight (28) North, Range Fifty-six (56) East Montana Principal Meridian, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the North one-quarter corner of Section 29, Township 28 North, Range 56 East M.P.M. proceed South 00°18' East along the one-quarter section line a distance of 1362.85 feet to the true point of beginning, thence continuing South 00°18' East a distance of 1103.65 feet; thence South 89°38' West on a line 66 feet North and parallel to the North city limits of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, a distance of 397.66 feet; thence North 00°18' West a distance of 346.18 feet; thence South 89°38' West a distance of 251.66 feet; thence North 00°18' West along the Montana Department of Highway right of way line a distance of 758.22 feet; thence North 89°42' East a distance of 648.55 feet to the true point of beginning. This tract of land contains 629,335 square feet or 14.45 acres more or less.

The area here annexed is contiguous to the boundaries of the town; no part of the area annexed is within the boundary of another municipality; the area is a single ownership piece of land.

A public hearing was had on the 5th day of June, 1978, at 7:45 P.M. at the Culbertson Town Council Chambers pursuant to notice and no protests where heard.

Section 2: The Town of Culbertson does hereby annex a tract of land described as follows:

A tract of land in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$), of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Twenty-eight (28) North, Range Fifty-six (56) East Montana Principal Meridian, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the North one-quarter corner of Section 29, Township 28 North, Range 56 East M.P.M. proceed South 00°18' East along the one-quarter section line a distance of 1362.85 feet to the true point of beginning, thence continuing South 00°18' East a distance of 1103.65 feet; thence South 89°38' West on a line 66 feet North and parallel to the North city limits of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, a distance of 397.66 feet; thence North 00°18' West a distance of 346.18 feet; thence South 89°38' West a distance of 251.66 feet; thence North 00°18' West along the Montana Department of Highway right of way line a distance of 758.22 feet; thence North 89°42' East a distance of 648.55 feet to the true point of beginning. This tract of land contains 629,335 square feet or 14.45 acres more or less.

ORDINANCE NO. 139

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DRILLING FOR AND PRODUCTION OF OIL AND GAS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

Section 1: The Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, makes these findings:

That there has been substantial oil and gas drilling activity in the nearby areas and that the technology of the drilling of oil and gas wells has advanced to a state where it is no longer necessary to drill directly over oil and gas in place.

Section 2: Therefore, it is ordained that the drilling for and production of oil and gas within the corporate limits of the Town of Culbertson is unlawful and is prohibited.

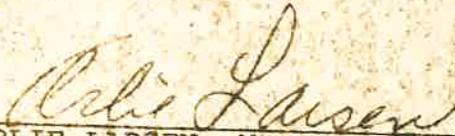
Section 3: The Town Attorney of the Town of Culbertson, Montana is empowered to enforce this ordinance by the use of injunction or other legal remedy.
