AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SEC. 7.02.070 GARBAGE, REFUSE, AND RUBBISH - FEES TO PROVIDE FOR A NEW RATE FORMULA AND GARBAGE HAULING RATES

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana:

Town Code Section 7.02.070 $\underline{\text{Fees}}$ is hereby amended as follows:

Delete subsections (a) and (b) in their entirety and add

- (a) The monthly rate for garbage hauling shall be calculated by multiplying the number of garbage cans times the number of hauls per can per week to yield the dollar charge to the consumer.
- (b) There shall be no residential or commercial rate distinction.
