

Ray Halvorson, Chairman of the Council opened the first of two public hearings concerning the community needs. Mike Alberi, Director of Utilities with HKM Associates was on hand to answer any questions that concerned the community survey and block grant program. There were fourteen interested persons present.

The survey used was taken from the Community Block Grant program example. A brief summary of the indentified needs in the community. Public Transportation, Retail Shopping Opportunities, Disabled/Handicapped Facilities, Job Training Opportunities and Water Quality. These were rated from 266 to 247 points. In the Local Government Leadership Role priority was utilities (water) and law enforcement.

Interesting responses came from age groups of more than 20 yrs old which was 60%, 30% of more than 30 yrs of age. From the survey 93 to 108 responses say Culbertson has grown in the last ten years. 55 Responses say Culbertson will continue to grow. 75 responses say it is important to grow. 69 responses were, Culbertson is a good place to live, 41 responses - Culbertson is an average place to live and 4 thought Culbertson was a poor place to live. The majority felt that an increase in all phases of community development will make this a better community to live in. 93 felt we need more businesses and 96 say we need more shopping. Few felt more chooses of housing would be good. Most felt that there house should be warmer.

Community input at this meeting was as follows: Transportation really is adequate with bus service going north-south and east-west. Some felt train service would be of some importance. For Retail Shopping the group felt the town should be encouraged in some way to get more businesses to come in. The Handicapped/Disabled was not necessarily meant to be a priority. Parks and playgrounds were sufficient. A lot of discussion around the needs for repairs to the swimming pool and the library building. Many questions concerning water and water facilities were asked. Why the bad taste and smell in the water. Almost impossible to drink, Bad, Bad. What can be done to correct these problems? Is the water fit to drink? What bacteria is in the water? What is turbitiy? Mr. Alberi and Water Supt. Donald Sylvester gave answers and reasons for the conditions.

To get better quality water would be to install a filteration system. This can be done by selling Revenue Bonds and grants. Community Block Grants are based on the needs of the community and \$400,000. is the most we could receive if we qualify. Application to the Department of Natural Resources is another source should we quality.

Once the filteration system is in it will require more man hours to operate it. There will be more operating costs and there will be a new water line laid from the river to the filteration sight. At the present time one reservior is leaking quite badly. This will have to be repaired leaving only one reservior for settlingand supplying the town. This will be quite a problem in itself. One method for repairing would be to dry it out enough to excavate the coal seams and line with bentonite at the cost of \$109,000. The drying time may be as long as several years. Method no. 2 would be to dry it out enough for humans to walk on and lay a flexible membrane liner. The cost of this is approximately \$160,000. With the filteration system this would eliminate time and expensive repairs.

The entire group was in agreement to turn all interests toward better quality water. Make water the first priority. The swimming pool repairs and the library building repairs as priority for another year.

With no further business the meeting adjourned until August 23, 1982 at 7:30 P.M. in the clerks office for the 2nd public hearing.

Without the CDBG many of our citizens would be faced with another hardship to pay special assessments and the increased water rates. The council will be responsible for the administravtive work .

The swimming pool problems were discussed again. The concessus of the group was that better quality water was still the number one priority. Without better quality water the pool will still have problems.

Motion made by Verle Lambert to adopt a resolution of intent to create a special improvement district, conditioned upon the awarding of the Community Development Block Grant. Second by Larry Rasmussen. The motion passed unanimously.
