January 3, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. The minutes of December 5th were read and approved.

Boy Scout, Kevin Miller attended as he is working on a badge.

Snowmobiles. Clerk was instructed to put a notice in the paper stating that snowmobilers are to take the shortest route out of town and that riding snowmobiles in town parks is prohibited and offenders will be cited.

Easement-State Highway Dept. An Easement/Use Permit was granted, and signed by the mayor and all 4 councilmen, to the Montana Department of Highways to use a tract of land three feet wide by fifteen long for the erection and maintenance of a traffic control guide sign. The location is the west boulevard of Third Avenue East and Highway 2. Clerk will have the easement filed at the Roosevelt County Courthouse.

Federal Revenue Sharing Funds. Larry Reitz made a motion to adopt a Resolution of Intent to obligate the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for a second pick-up, truck, diaphram pump and a light plant. The fund will be expended in a reasonable amount of time. Gordon Miller seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Landfill</u>. Lynn reported everything is 0.K. at the landfill. The dirt pile will last approximately l to $l\frac{1}{2}$ months. Landfill hours for January and February are from l:00-3:00 p.m. Lynn intends to burn the pit at the landfill soon. The county sanitarian, hospital and fire department will be notified prior to burning.

Doug will build his own ventilation fan for much less than purchasing a manhole ventilation fan. The council encouraged him to get it done.

 $\underline{\text{SID}}\ \#6$. Gordon Miller made a motion to call in all SID #6 outstanding bonds and to cease assessments in 1989. Larry Reitz seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gordon Miller and Larry Reitz. Opposed: Dave Plummer. Not Voting: Edwin Bertino. MOTION CARRIED.

Clerk was instructed to write to the 3 banks in Sidney in regards to interest rates on CD investments.

<u>Fixed Assets</u>. There was discussion on fixed assets. Larry suggested that asset items purchased at a cost \$500.00 or more be placed in fixed assets.

The Lamplite Store asked if they needed to have a building permit approved to remodel the inside of the building. They are not required to have a building permit approved by the Town Council. Clerk was asked to write a letter to the County Assessor and inform him of the improvement.

Property and Supply Bureau. Dave Plummer made a motion to adopt a Resolution authorizing A. Douglas Finnicum, James Baldwin and Raedelle Aspenlieder to purchase federal surplus property from the State of Montana, Property and Supply Bureau for the Town of Culbertson. Gordon Miller seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

General Journal Vouchers. General Journal Voucher #85 was approved and signed.

February 6, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Larry Reitz arrived later. The minutes of January 3, 1989 were read and approved.

Senior Citizens. Senior Citizen members Louise Cooper, Lucille Olson and Edward Anklam attended the meeting. They requested the Town Council reduce the monthly rental for the Community Center from \$100 to \$50. They explained the County has cut the Senior Citizen Program budget. Dave Plummer made a motion to reduce the Senior Citizen rent to \$50.00/month, effective February 1989. Edwin Bertino seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Dave Plummer, Edwin Bertino, Gordon Miller. Absent and not voting Larry Reitz. MOTION CARRIED.

Park Renovation. Jim reported on the meeting held in regards to the park improvement project. The Chamber voted to make use of the \$4337.30 that is in the 75 Jubilee account by putting it back into the community. The Women's Club will head the program and also donate around \$600. The Cottonwood Club will be involved and Boy Scouts will plant trees. Other interested organizations were the American Legion Auxiliary, Lions Club and FFA Chapter. The Council is willing to work with the group, but encouraged them to consult water commissioner Doug Finnicum as he is aware of the location of underground sprinklers and water lines. The Council agreed to obligate \$1000. out of the FY 1989-90 budget.

Maynard Cellmer would like to retire as of now. He said he would be available to work on a contract basis when the weather warms up. The Council said it would be up to Doug to line Maynard up. The Council decided to advertise for a full-time assistant city maintenance man. Jim will work up a job description. This will be advertised in the paper for 3 consecutive weeks.

<u>Burlington Northern Depot Closing</u>. The Council was asked if they would be interested in a reopening of the record concerning the closing of the Burlington Northern Depot in Culbertson. The Council does not wish to pursue this.

Judge Pat Bradley passed along some information coming up in the State Legislature. HB493 would charge criminals to fund county jails. This would change the present surcharge for county attorneys to \$20 in misdemeanor offenses and \$45 in felonies. This would adversely effect City Courts as they would have to keep a seperate entry on their ledgers to dispose of $\frac{1}{2}$ of the \$20 to the County Treasurer for the maintenance, etc. of the county jail. This means that \$10 would stay in the city and \$10 would go to the county. Judge Bradley asked the council to send a letter to our legislator to oppose this bill. Jim will send the letter.

Ambulance Shed. The council decided to just have Doug adjust the springs and install the motor for the garage door opener on the ambulance shed.

Mayor Baldwin presented plaques to Leo Waldhausen and Greg Hofman in appreciation for their service and dedication on the Volunteer Ambulance Service for over 20 years.

<u>Lighting Refund</u>. There has been an error made on 4 of Bernie Finnicum's properties on the street lighting assessment for the past 2 years. (See copy attached for property descriptions.) Gordon Miller made a motion to refund 1987 & 1988 street lighting assessment on these 4 properties. Larry Reitz seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

April 3, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. The minutes of March 6, 1989 were read and approved.

Gene Schmitz, property owner of 120 3rd St. W. attended. Gene said his bill is currently \$708.40 and he wanted to verify that this is the amount that would have to be paid before the water would be turned-on on this property. The council explained the new hook-up fee is \$450.00 until January 1, 1990 then it will be \$500.00. If the property owner chooses to pay the new hook-up fee vs the current amount of the bill the monthly charges of \$15.40 begin again at the time the new hook-up fee is paid. A new tap in the sewer main is \$150.00. There is also a \$25.00 turn-on fee and a \$50.00 deposit required prior to turning the water on. Property owners are also responsible for the repair and maintenance of the curb stop. Gene requested a letter explaining this. Clerk was instructed to write him a letter stating the above.

Landfill. Lynn said the road to the landfill is in need of more scorio. The road to the landfill off Highway 16 could use a culvert. Jim will talk to LaVerne Schledewitz about this and about digging a new pit this fall. Lynn was instructed to turn violators of the tarp law away at the landfill gate. The council discussed putting the maintenance of the landfill and the garbage collection under one contract. Landfill hours effective April 1 are from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. on Saturday and Monday.

Pet License. Dave Plummer made a motion to adopt Ordinance #165 effective January 1, 1990 amending section 8.04.020 License Requirements; Fees. Every person registering a male or spayed female dog or cat shall pay therefore the sum of five dollars (\$5.00). Every person registering a female dog or cat shall pay the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00). Gordon Miller seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Board of Plumbers. The council received a letter from the Board of Plumbers in regards to our previous request to allow Brien Larsen to work as an apprentice under LeRoy Larsen. The letter stated, "It is the Board's opinion that it is up to the Apprenticeship & Training Bureau, not the Board to approve apprentices. The Board would hope that the Bureau would continue its past practice and only indenture apprentices to licensed master plumbers. The Board is not in favor of extending the licensing exemption in Culbertson to include Brien Larsen as they feel there is not enough work to warrant the need for an additional plumber." Clerk will forward a copy of this letter to both Brien Larsen and LeRoy Larsen

Culbertson State Agency expressed an interest in an insurance review and/or cost comparison. The council agreed to have Bruce Houle review the policy and bid.

Lawn Mower Rental Agreement. The Roosevelt County Fair Board would like to renew the Lawn Mower Rental Agreement. The council agreed to leave it the same as last year, \$25.00 for the first hour of use and \$15.00 for each additional hour thereafter. The Town will provide the lawn mower, labor, gasoline and maintenance.

Oil Spill. Hannes Car Care and Culbertson Implement have oil spills. They have been asked to clean this up and haul it to the landfill. Culbertson Implement will be demolishing the house south of the Implement. Clerk will let them know they need to file a demolition permit. Jim will talk to someone in the Sheriff's Department about the oil spills on town streets.

<u>Lanfill</u>. Milo Hansen from Sidney requested permission to go thru the <u>landfill</u> in search of aluminum. Council denied this request for liability reasons.

Jim reported that around the end of May-first of June the Property & Supply Bureau in Helena will have pick-ups and possibly trucks. He will be in contact with someone in Helena on this.

Clerk was instructed to send Alfred Heupel another bill for leased property rent.

Raedelle and Jim will draw up a lease for Lloyd Aspenlieder on property by the sewer lagoon.

There was a complaint about the old building on Bill Finnicum's property, and the danger of the building collapsing. Jim will talk to Bill about this.

Swimming Pool. The coucil selected the swimming pool staff for the 1989 season: Manager-Roxanne Nickoloff, Assistant Manager-Sharon Young, Lifeguards-Ron Reitz, Janet Peters, Faith Portra, Peni Gandrud, Jackie Peters and Lea Lindvig. Darin Peterson will be on the lifeguard call list if needed. Wages are \$5.00/hr. manager and \$4.50/hr. for assistant manager and lifeguards. Doug and Raedelle will write a job description for the manager and the council will review this. Council would like Roxanne to come to the May 1st meeting. Clerk will send letters to the applicants not selected for employment.

The council reveiwed the applications for the maintenance position. Mayor Baldwin appointed a selection committee: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller and Jim Baldwin. The selection committee's first meeting will be Tuesday, April 4th at 6:30 p.m.

May 1, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. The minutes of April 3, 1989 were read and approved.

Evelyn Casterline, Women's Club Representative, asked the council for their approval of a kitchen shower for the "Community Center - Senior Citizen Center". They would like to try to get it more furnished in the kitchen so when you rent the hall you don't have to bring everything from home. The council approved and added it was a good idea.

Marylyn Weeks, Women's Club Representative, said they are interested in sponsoring an old fashioned 4th of July Celebration with dedication ceremonies for the park. There was some discussion on a fire works display. The council suggested they talk to the volunteer fire department and ask them for their help.

Nancy Hjelm and Ron Larsen attended. Attorney Greg Hennessy recently drafted an easement for the sewer line on the property they recently purchased, lot 2 block 17 Bruegger Second Addition. Brock and Nancy Hjelm would not agree to the paragraph stating "OWNER, its successors and assigns agrees not to build, create or construct or permit to be built, created, or constructed any obstruction, building, engineering works or other structures upon, over, or under the strip of land herein described or within 17½ feet of the centerline of the above described easement on the side opposite the house, or that would interfere with said sewer line or TOWN'S rights hereunder." After much discussion and talk of possible moving the sewer main, the council agreed to strike the above mention paragraph. Also, the foundation is 4 feet from the centerline. Attorney Hennessy will draft a new easement.

<u>Surplus Property & Supply Bureau</u>. Around the end of May the Surplus Property and Supply Bureau will come out with a list that should have some pick-ups to watch for. Could possibly purchase a pick-up for 20% less than last auction sale price.

City Gravel Yard. Doug said he is about out of gravel in the yard. There will be a contractor in the area soon with a crushing crew. Jim will talk to the contractor about the possibility and cost of getting some for the town.

<u>Fire Hall.</u> The Fire Hall list of materials to install an energy efficient furnace is available. Clerk has been instructed to contact Petrolane, Miller Oil and Culbertson Sheet Metal so they all have the opportunity to bid the job. Sealed bids will be opened at the regular council meeting on June 5, 1989.

Bids to install wire to pump receptable for water pump under the bridge were reviewed. Project will be given to low bidder, Culbertson Sheet Metal and Electric. Project should be done as soon as possible.

Reservoir. Director of Public Works, Doug Finnicum, discussed the report from Montana Salinity Control Assoc. on the reservoirs with the council. It was decided to drain the upper reservoir and let it dry out. This will be discussed again after it dries out.

Maintenance Worker Position. Jim reported for the selection committee. The vote was 3 to 2 in favor of Jerry Kozak. He will start on May 8, 1989. Comment was made that the council agreed the new man would start on May 1st not May 8th. Jim discussed the following with Jerry Kozak: 9 month probation, 8 hours per day, limited overtime, overtime at 1½ time reg. hourly rate, \$6.00/ hour pay, under Doug's supervision, explained payroll deductions-Social Security, PERS, Federal & State Tax, 10 holidays, performance appraisal, unemployment coverage.

Bus Parking Signs. The school bus parking signs on the west side of the school were authorized and installed by the town. The school district needs to talk with the Town Council if they want these signs removed.

Swimming Pool. The 1989 season opening date is tentatively set for May 29th. Pool prices are \$1.00 individual ticket for one session, \$20.00 season ticket for one person and \$45.00 season ticket for a family. Council agreed

June 5, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Edwin Bertino was absent. The minutes of May 1, 1989 were read and approved with the addition of "no insurance coverage-health or life for the maintenance worker position."

Volunteer Fire Dept. Lloyd Aspenlieder represented the Volunteer Fire Department. The fire department would like to purchase 1000 feet of 5" diameter suction hose. This hose would hook-up directly to the hydrant and then to the truck. This would be helpful in fighting large fires and at the hospital if there were a fire. If the fire department committed to purchasing 700' in a 2 year period, $\frac{1}{2}$ of the amount could be paid the first year and the other $\frac{1}{2}$ the second year with no interest. The hose comes in 100' sections and the cost is \$7.50/foot plus would need between \$700-800 for fittings. The council said they would have to see what the balance in the fund was after the furnace job was done at the fire hall. The fire department should include this in their budget proposal for FY 1989-90.

There was discussion on running approximately 300' of 8" water main on the east side of the hospital and installing a hydrant. Doug will get cost estimates for this.

Robert Bell asked if therewas a Local Access Channel available thru the cable tv company. He said this would be nice for fire safety education as well as other local events. We'll check with the cable company on this.

Robert Bell would like the council to consider requiring new construction on residential houses to install $1\frac{1}{2}$ " water service lines instead of 3/4". The reason is that if fire sprinklers will be installed in the home it is necessary to have at least 1" service line and better yet $1\frac{1}{2}$ " line. The council said they would discuss this with new home builders at the time the building permit is being reviewed.

Robert Bell asked if the town had an emergency response plan. The fire department should be informed. Jim said Dan Sietsema was organizing this. Jim will talk to Laverne Schledewitz about this.

<u>Hospital</u>. Ken Forbregd inquired for the hospital about the road on the east side of the hospital. He wandered if this was a town street. Clerk will research original plat.

Alvin Lien inquired about the possibility of getting a 1" meter. He would have to pay the cost difference from regular meter to 1" meter, about \$50.00. Alvin said he would let Doug know when he wanted one.

The next regular meeting for the Culbertson Town Council will be July 10th due to Monday, July 3rd being a holiday and the 4th of July holiday. Clerk will put a notice in the paper.

Volunteer Fire Department. Robert Bell represented the volunteer fire department. The department submitted a bill for approval and payment for 550' coupled 5" large diameter hose and necessary fittings in the amount of \$5032.00. Heiman, Inc. will ship an additional 500' of hose if the commitment is made to purchase the additional amount within the next 6 months. August 7, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Absent: Gordon Miller. The minutes of July 10th, 20th, 25th and 27th, 1989 were read and approved.

Sheriff's Department. Sheriff John Grainger, County Commissioner Lavern Schledewitz and 2 deputies talked with the town council prior to the opening of the meeting. Sheriff Grainger was informed by the County Commissioners that his department budget had to be cut. Grainger cut the department staff by 4 men. The cut is effective August 31, 1989. At the present time Culbertson is only paying about 6% of the sheriff contract, Poplar is paying 40% and Wolf Point is paying 80% according to Grainger. After the cuts the area will be manned as follows: Culbertson, Bainville, Froid area - 2 men, Poplar - 2 men, and Wolf Point - 5 men. Grainger figured that each town would be paying about 80% of their sheriff contract after the cut. Lavern Schledewitz said each person in the county would have to pay approximately \$62.40 just to cover the Sheriff Departments budget alone. This was according the the population figures Lavern had.

Senior Citizens. Louise Cooper attended on behalf of the Senior Citizens. She was interested in the air conditioning bids. The bids were as follows: Miller Oil Co. bid \$1529.52 for a 3 ton central air unit — installed; Culbertson Sheet Metal and Electric bid \$2080.00 for a 3 ton coil blower assembly, 3 ton condensor, transition, roof curb for unit, line set, return air grill, all electrical, thermostat and base and labor. Dave Plummer made a motion to accept bid from apparent low bidder Miller Oil Co. for \$1529.52. Edwin Bertino seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Dave Plummer, Edwin Bertino and Larry Reitz. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

Budget 1989-90 FY. Larry Reitz made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 258 setting the All-Purpose General levy 78.95 mills, Library 2.95 mills and Public Employees Retirement System .92 mills for a total of 82.82 mills for fiscal year ending June 30, 1990. Dave Plummer seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Larry Reitz, Dave Plummer and Edwin Bertino. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

School Sewer Rate. School clerk, Dorothy Anderson discussed the sewer rate for the school with Mayor Baldwin. She felt the school should get a break because they are watering lawns and trees. Council said they are on the commercial rate and could not make an exception to the sewer charge.

Cable TV Franchise Fee. Council confirmed the Cable TV Franchise Fee Ordinance to be paid effective July 1, 1989 and paid every 30 days.

Lynn also gave clerk a list of property owners that need to trim trees and/or hedges so the garbage truck can pass by safely. Clerk will give property owners 10 days to take care of the problem or the town will and they will be charged. Lavern Schledewitz said Poplar is having landfill problems and wanted to know if the Town Council was interested in hearing what Poplar council has to say. Town Council was not interested. Landfill hours are 1:00 - 8:00 p.m.

Cleaning Contract. Bev Raaum resigned her cleaning contract for the Town Hall effective September 1, 1989. Bev said she would clean the park bathrooms next season if the council wanted her to. Council said they would like Bev to clean the park bathrooms again next season but would like to discuss the contract amount with her. After cost from Pedersen is received, Jim will talk to each of the property owners about the total cost to them and see who is in favor of this before the council acts on a Special Improvement District.

Building Rent. Dave Plummer would like to rent the old pumphouse to store tires for \$100.00/year. December 4, 1989. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Absent: Edwin Bertino. The November 6, 1989 minutes were read and approved.

Donald Loomer with Webster, Foster & Weston talked with the council about the abilities of their firm.

Remi Bidegaray represented the FFA Chapter. They are working on a community service project - Building On American Communities - and would like to put up a Welcome sign outside of town in all 4 directions. Council told Remi they needed to contact the Montana State Highway Department. Jim will get name and address.

Cemetery. Roy Lemieux represented the Cemetery Committee. Roy and the council discussed the urn plots at the cemetery. Stones will be required to be flush with the ground and each 3'x3' plot will cost \$15.00. Jim and Roy will measure other stones for a good size limit. Council will put cemetery rules and regulations in ordinance form in the near future. Another item to be addressed in the ordinance is the monument marker, which is a temporary marker, must be removed once the headstone is in place. Monument markers are a nuisance to mow around and are not necessary once the headstone is in place. Roy also said there is need for more dirt on the crossroad at the cemetery this spring.

Landfill. Monitoring wells report from the landfill are 3/4" water in #1, #2 & #3 are dry. Landfill hours at this time are from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. Second and final reading on Ordinance #168 adding to section 7.02071 Solid Waste Landfill Fees of the Culbertson Town Code, adding the cost of hauling material in cubic yards to the landfill. Dave Plummer made a motion to adopt Ordinance #168. Larry Reitz seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz and Gordon Miller. Absent and not voting: Edwin Bertino. MOTION CARRIED.

Sidewalks. Council discussed sidewalk ordinances and liability risks. A letter and sample ordinances were received from Bob Worthington with MMIA. Attorney Greg Hennessy will prepare an ordinance that addresses bad areas for the council to consider. There was a complaint about the sidewalk on the north side of the downtown armory. The water runs off the roof onto the sidewalk and causes a sheet of ice. Clerk was asked to write the school a letter about this and the mayor will sign the letter.

A no dumping sign will be put at the west end of 3rd avenue west.

Mayor Baldwin had information on putting signs up on main street as it is a State Highway. The town can request permission from the highway department to install a sign, the town would buy the sign.

Sheriff Department. At the November 6th meeting Sheriff Grainger assured the council he would have law enforcement radar 3rd avenue east, but to the best of the council's knowledge, this has not been done. Clerk was asked to draft letter to Sheriff Grainger about this and expect a reply. Mayor Baldwin will sign the letter.

Cleaning Contract. Paul Jacobs resigned his cleaning contract. Contract has been given to Raedelle. She will monitor the cleaning hours for a couple months.

Due to the holidays, the next regular meeting will be January 8, 1990. At this meeting Mayor Baldwin, Councilmen Dave Plummer and Gordon Miller will all be sworn in for another term. Also the City Judge will be re-appointed.

Garbage Rates. Due to increased garbage costs and less incoming revenue, the

garbage rate needed to be increased. Gordon Miller made a motion to raise the garbage rate \$1.00 for all customers effective December 31, 1989 bills. Larry Reitz seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gordon Miller, Larry Reitz and Dave Plummer. Absent and not voting: Edwin Bertino. MOTION CARRIED. Clerk will put a notice in the paper about the increase.

Clerk has been instructed to write Dennis Elgen a letter and ask him to come to the January 8, 1990 meeting to discuss airport repairs and maintenance that may be needed in the future.

Jeff Nickoloff wrote Dave Plummer a letter. Jeff asked Dave if he had any suggestions of what he could do to improve the community and town. Doug will get a list for Dave so he can respond to Jeff's letter.

The Women's Club is having their annual chili cook-off on December 16th with the proceeds going to the swimming pool. The council and mayor will enter the contest. Raedelle will make the chili and they will come up with a theme and serve.

Overhead Heater. Three bids were received on the overhead heater. Bids were from Don Johnson \$140.00 - Medicine Lake, William Balbinot \$106.00 - Wolf Point, and Jim Rowe \$110.00 - Culbertson. Dave Plummer made a motion to reject all bids and re-advertise. Larry Reitz seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz and Gordon Miller. Absent and not voting: Edwin Bertino. MOTION CARRIED.

GJV'S. General journal vouchers #108, 109, 110, and 111 were approved and signed.

Council reviewed a price list from Randy Erickson - Mon-Dak Fire Detection. At the present time we are receiving scheduled service from Thilmony's Fire Extinguisher Sales & Service in Sidney. If new equipment is purchased the two companies will be compared.

The council noted the canvass of votes cast at the Municipal General Election held in Culbertson on the 7th day of November, 1989.

The Department of Labor & Industry, Division of Workers' Compensation inspected the workplace under the town's operation, ownership or control and disclosed conditions which fail to comply with provisions of the Montana Safety Act. The recommendation was that an instrument for determining air quality (sniffer) be purchased and used before entering a confined place. Gordon Miller recommended that the town purchase a sniffer. All were in favor of this recommendation, except Edwin Bertino who was absent.

Handicapped Parking. The Senior Citizens requested one car length additional handicapped parking in front of the Town Hall. The council decided they would put handicap parking to the south corner in front of the library. The painting and sign moving will be done this spring.

The stop sign on the corner of 3rd street and 1st avenue west was painted on Halloween. The sheriff's department is aware of this and they have submitted the required report. Council decided not to replace the sign at this time.

Computer Software. Clerk expressed dissatisfaction with Diversified Computing. Also council reviewed a proposal from Utility Billing Specialist, Inc. Council felt if Diversified wasn't satisfactory now it could get worse.
