January 3, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session. Bernie W. Finnicum was sworn into the office of town councilman. The following were present: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum, Greg Staudinger, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Doug Finnicum, Lynn Labatte and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Absent: Gordon Miller. Guests: Ila Mae Forbregd, Fred Poland, Dean and Lu Simensen, Alan Aspenlieder, Dave Plummer and Steve Baldwin. The December 6th, 9th and 10th, 1993 minutes were read and approved.

Snow Plowing. Fred Poland wanted to know if the town had an ordinance for snow removal. Jim explained that a town our size is not equipped for snow removal. Fred said some people are plowing driveways and pushing the snow out into the streets and leaving ridges. He suggested we put a notice in the paper addressing the private plowing. Clerk will put a notice in the paper.

Dean and Lu Simensen said they are looking in to putting a double wide mobile home on the east end of their two lots. They have 2 - 50'x140' lots with the 140' running east and west. Jim suggested that they sub-divide the lots according to their plan, as it would be to their benefit if they should ever sell. They also asked about a building permit and hooking on to water and sewer and what the charges would be. Those items were explained along with the costs involved.

Fire Dept. Alan Aspenlieder represented the fire department and explained they would like to use part of their supplies budget to help purchase turnouts and helmets for the personal safety of the firemen rather than the supplies they had listed on their original budget. Council did not object.

Investments. Council discussed different investment options. Information from Culbertson State Bank last week was: $2\frac{1}{2}$ yr. CD for \$100,000 or more 3.75% interest, Treasury Bills 4 yr. minimum \$100,000 4.75 - 4.80% and 5 yr. Treasury Bill minimum \$100,000 5.15%. Treasury Bills are very secure. Attorney Hennessy said this is an option that can be done. Clerk will check on a 6 month CD and compare it to the Super Now Interest Rate. Greg Staudinger made a motion to put \$200,000 in Treasury Bills for 5 years. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Bernie W. Finnicum and Gene Dillman. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

Landfill. Mayor Badwin said there are problems arising due to keeping our landfill open to comply with Subtitle D regulations. The town received a letter from Barry Damschen, Damschen & Associates, Inc. stating he met with the State Solid & Hazardous Waste Bureau people. Damschen's letter said "Basically, it was agreed that the new trench can only be excavated to the depths indicated on the originally designed operation plan and cross-sections dated Dec., 1986. It was also agreed that the placement of waste in the new trench can start immediately even though there is a small amount of capacity remaining in the existing trench. This will allow the existing trench to be used as a wet weather disposal area to complete it's life. In regards to the filling of the new trench, the three state officials indicated that the trench can be filled in several 4 to 6 feet deep lifts." Jim talked to Lynn and told him to dump in pit #3 and Lynn refused. The same day Jim called Attorney Hennessy.

Attorney Hennessy asked Lynn if he had anything to add to Jim's discussion. Lynn said the state told him we cannot have 2 pits open at the same time. Lynn wants an official O.K. from the State of Montana in a letter. He would also like to see the road coming in to the pit done like the other pits.

January 3, 1994 cont.

Attorney Hennessy said under the Statute - the Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer and he has the authority to give instruction unless there is evidence of the contrary. Under the terms of both the hauling and landfill contracts it is required that Lynn perform to "town satisfaction". No basis under those contracts to challenge the Mayor on the present facts.

Attorney Hennessy said he spoke with Bureau Chief Jon Dilliard and he confirmed it's okay having the 2 cells open according to Damschen's letter, we are in full compliance at this point. Jon said how to put the footprint in the new pit - layer across the bottom of the new pit. We are allowed to spread the footprint. The State stands by the plan as Barry Damschen submitted it. Pit #3 was dug as deep as the original plan had specified. It could have been dug deeper yet if we would have submitted a new design plan. The State has no problem with what we are doing or plan to do. Mayor Baldwin said submitting a new design plan at this late time is not an option. Attorney Hennessy's position as counsel for the town, he said we have all the authorization we need to proceed.

Jim said Lynn's truck is 8' wide and the road in varies 13' - 14' wide. Greg Staudinger made a motion to adopt Resolution #276. A Resolution directing the landfill operations be conducted and completed in accordance with the State Health and Environmental Sciences Plan. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Gene Dillman and Bernie W. Finnicum. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

Lynn was given a copy of Barry Damschen's letter dated December 21, 1993. Attorney Hennessy asked Jon Dilliard about the footprint. If we do the footprint according to Barry's design and recommendation, are we going to end up in the same situation as Kalispell, Jon said no.

Landfill monitoring wells #1, 2 & 3 are all dry.

Landfill hours at this time are Monday and Saturday from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.

Lynn may need the county to bust cover dirt loose.

Jim said the county graveled the county road in to the landfill, the road in pit #3 and a pile on top.

Jim wants to meet with Lynn Tuesday. Lynn said between 11:00 - 11:30 a.m.

Penny Carter had a complaint about her garbage pick-up. Lynn said she needs to put the garbage at the rack and in cans.

<u>Library Heat</u>. The Amana heater for the library went out. The furnace in the basement is being used. Doug closed off 2 vents in the basement and can close all vents in the basement if necessary.

Water Service Outside of Town Limits. Doug discussed the water rate with Ted Williams, Black Hills Trucking. They are paying 10¢/42 gal barrel. Ted didn't think Black Hills would purchase water from the town if the rates were raised. Doug recommended leaving this as is. The council discussed water service for outside of town limits. Items discussed were: rate - twice the in-town rate would be \$3.36/1000 gal.; service line - size at discretion of council, 2" max., 200 P.S.I.; other materials - saddle, corporation, curb stops as needed, R.P. Back Flow Prevention, meter; all costs to run the service line and hook on to the water main are to be borne by the user; customer would be required to pay - hook-up cost, minimum water charge, turn-on fee and a deposit;

pressure - may not be as high as in town depending on customers lot elevation; service area - no more than 1 mile from nearest main; easements - landowner responsibility.

Council heard the first and final reading of Ordinance #180, an Ordinance authorizing the distribution and sale of Town of Culbertson treated water outside of the town limits. Gene Dillman made a motion to adopt Ordinance #180. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

Part-Time Temporary Employee. Council discussed the possibility of a part-time and temporary employee. Doug will talk to Rod Snyder about helping with town work on a temporary or "as needed" basis during the winter months. Steady or "flex time" during the summer. Doug felt we should start him at \$7.00/hr. for steady and \$7.50/hr. for the "as needed" times. Council agreed. Doug said Loren Schledewitz, C B & F said he would let Steve take off to keep his certification up. Steve is willing to go. The town will pay his expenses. Council is in favor of keeping Steve certified.

Jim talked to Bill Juve with the Highway Department Maintenance about getting mix to patch streets. The town can buy the mix the state has east of town this spring. Jim will talk to Juve in the spring again.

<u>Engineering</u>. Greg Staudinger made a motion to engage Damschen and Associates engineering firm for the landfill. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Gene Dillman and Bernie W. Finnicum. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Sheriff Contract</u>. Greg Staudinger said we should start putting pressure on the county commissioners about the sheriff contracts and get the public to also get involved in discussing this issue with the commissioners. Jim will talk to an individual in town about his possible interest in police work, just to check him out.

Garbage Rate Adjustments. Several months ago Buzz Mattelin with the Culbertson Athletic Club had requested a reduction in his garbage rate as the cafe part was no longer open. At that time, the council said they wanted to wait until the landfill situation was settled so the changes could be done at the same time. Council reconsidered the Culbertson Athletic Clubs request and due to the amount of garbage generated, reduced the garbage rate to \$14.50/month. Then the carwash rate was brought up and the council reduced that garbage rate also to \$14.50/month.

Gene Dillman made a motion to adopt Resolution #275, a Resolution to address State and Federal Unfunded Mandates. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED. Clerk will send copies to State and Federal Senators and Representatives.

Greg Staudinger made a motion for final reading of Ordinance #178. An Ordinance amending the water and sewer rates. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Gene Dillman and Bernie W. Finnicum. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

January 3, 1994 cont.

Greg Staudinger made a motion for final reading of Ordinance #179. An Ordinance amending Town Code Section 7.02.070 to increase the landfill portion of the garbage collection rates. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Gene Dillman and Bernie W. Finnicum. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

Council gave the okay to get the crawler tracks tightened up.

February 7, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gene Dillman, Greg Staudinger, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Doug Finnicum, Lynn Labatte and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Absent: Gordon Miller. Guests: From Froid - Greg Sunwall, Lee Vannatta and Bruce Crain; Roosevelt County Commissioner Dean Harmon; Evelyn Casterline, Karen Baxter and Keenan Engelke. The January 3, 1994 minutes were read and approved.

Landfill. Mayor Greg Sunwall and Councilmen Lee Vannatta and Bruce Crain from Froid were here with interest in the landfill issue. Mayor Baldwin had worked out the costs for full compliance to Subtitle "D" EPA Requirements for the towns of Culbertson and Froid. The increase would be \$14.37/month. The estimated cost with liner exemption and no-migration petition would be an increase of \$5.38/month. It should be noted that past figures for the Culbertson Landfill with exemption were figured with the liner exemption only. New figures include the no-migration petition as this is now issued with the liner exemption. As of February 1, 1994 Bainville is hauling their garbage to the Williston landfill.

The only way to find out if there is a chance for this exemption is to do a hydrogeological study of the landfill site. The estimated cost is between 6000 - 10,000. - three wells can be drilled, 2 for soil types and 1 to water. From this information an over 90% estimate can be determined as to the likelyhood of an exemption and a 100% determination that a complete study will not help.

If the town council should choose to do the 3 well option, a drilling crew is available at Sidney to do the work when a favorable 3 to 4 day window of above freezing weather occurs, probably sometime in late February or early March.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to do the 3 well option. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gene Dillman and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED. Clerk will send Damschen and Associates a letter stating we will do the 3 well option.

Froid's Mayor Sunwall pledged his town to continue using Culbertson Landfill until April 1, 1994 to give us time to do this testing. Should the exemption be denied, Froid will enter into an agreement with L & L Sanitation and haul their solid waste to Williston.

<u>Library</u>. Evelyn Casterline expressed concern about the structural damage and heat situation at the library. Today it was 58°. Evelyn also asked that the council keep their minds open to another building. Doug guessed it would cost \$1500 - \$1600. to replace the furnace. Gene Dillman made a motion to have Doug check with M.D.U., Miller Oil and Culbertson Sheet Metal on furnace prices with Doug installing it and for Doug to take the best deal. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Airport</u>. Dean Harmon said the airport project is nearing the end of the money and construction. The project is 97% done and about \$27,000. left to be paid. Right now the project is at 104% of budget, but with grass seeding and mulching it will be 105% of budget. The majority of the overrun was due to the soft spot at the east end. After some discussion on grass seeding and mulching, it was decided for Dean to see if we can't avoid this all together.

February 7, 1994 cont.

With a change in the council after the last election, it is up to the council to elect a new council president. Gene Dillman moved that Greg Staudinger be President of the Council. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded. Those voting in favor: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gordon Miller. MOTION CARRIED. Council responsibilities were re-assigned as follows: Gordon Miller - Water & Sewer; Greg Staudinger - Finance & Ordinance; Gene Dillman - Library, Pool & Parks; Bernie W. Finnicum - Airport, Streets & Alleys; Jim Baldwin - Landfill. No objections were raised.

Members of the ambulance crew would like a stop sign on one of the streets a block from the hospital and ambulance shed. Council asked Doug to find out where they want the signs and do what can be done to accomodate them.

It was brought up that fuel for the landfill should be alternated between businesses. Lynn said he was told by the council when Miller Oil bought out Gandrud Oil to buy 2 from Miller Oil then 1 from Oelkers. Clerk will check past minutes.

<u>Landfill</u>. Landfill monitoring wells #1, 2 & 3 are all dry. Landfill hours at this time are Monday and Saturday from 1:00-3:00 p.m. Tracks were tightened up. Jim talked to Allan Pedersen about busting dirt loose as soon as weather permits.

Council wanted to note that we may have to negotiate a temporary haul elsewhere with Lynn on April 9th if we don't have 100% approval for the liner exemption and no-migration petition. If the exemption and petition fall through all together there will be a complete change over. Jim ran it by Lynn and he nodded his head in agreement.

Interest Rates. Interest rates today were Super Now -2.53% APY, a 6 month CD for \$100,000. or more 3.23% APY. Council said to put \$300,000. in a 6 month CD. On 2-4-94 town invested \$199,589. in a maturity of \$200,000. Treasury Bill for 5 years at an interest rate of 5.06%.

GJV. General journal voucher #96 was approved and signed.

Council received a letter from Roger Anderson, O.D. requesting that the sewer, garbage and construction fee charges be waived for his unique situation of a satellite office for one day a week. Council said he is getting the lowest commercial garbage rate now and they can't help him anymore than that.

Doug will be gone for schooling February 23rd - 25th.

Raedelle will be gone to the Clerk's Institute for the advanced session this year March 16th - 18th.

Mayor Baldwin signed the Street Lighting Agreement and Municipal Street Lighting and Equipment Rental Agreement with Montana-Dakota Utilities.

The deadline to file is March 11, 1994 and cost is \$50.00. Gene Dillman made a motion to file an Objection to Application. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Attorney Hennessy will file the application.

April 4, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session. Gordon Oelkers was sworn into the office of town councilman. The following were present: Bernie W. Finnicum, Greg Staudinger, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Doug Finnicum, Lynn Labatte and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Absent: Gene Dillman. Guests: Marlyn Brookman, Ken Forbregd and Steve Baldwin. The March 7, 1994 minutes were read and approved.

Marlyn Brookman, candidate for Roosevelt County Sheriff, discussed the ideas he had for the County Sheriff Dept. if he were elected.

April 4, 1994 cont.

Sheriff Contract. Council discussed the estimated cost for the sheriff contract for FY 1994-95 and the possibility of taking the yearly cost to replace the car out of the payment to the county. This cost could be put aside within the town budget and be expended when the car is needed. Mayor Baldwin will discuss the sheriff contract with the Mayors of Froid and Bainville.

Stop Signs. Doug said the stop signs the ambulance crew requested are up on 2 corners of 7th Street and 3rd Ave. E. Gordon suggested that a notice be put in the paper noting where they are and why.

River Pump. Doug said the crissafulli pump, made in 1969, needs repair. A floating pump costs approximately \$3500.00 for the pump itself, could build the framework ourself or buy the framework for \$6500.00. Doug will have to repair the crissafulli this year as he will be putting it in the river this month. Council will keep the floating pump in mind when doing the budget for FY 1994-95.

Parks. Council discussed the idea of contract labor for the parks this year. Greg Staudinger made a motion to negotiate contract labor with Gary Johnston for the parks. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Bernie W. Finnicum and Gordon Oelkers. Absent and not voting: Gene Dillman. MOTION CARRIED.

Swimming Pool. Town will advertise for swimming pool help for the 1994 season with applications due by May 2, 1994 at 5:00 p.m.

GJV. General journal voucher #98 was approved and signed.

<u>Building Permits</u>. Building permits for Bruno Ostwald, Dean Simensen and Stanley Johnson were approved.

Greg Staudinger made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 277. A Resolution calling for an election, to be held on the primary election date, on the question of conducting a local government review and establishing a study commission. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Greg Staudinger, Bernie W. Finnicum and Gordon Oelkers. Absent and not voting: Gene Dillman. MOTION CARRIED.

 $\underline{\text{M.D.U. Franchise Agreement}}$. Attorney Hennessy will work up the franchise agreement with Montana-Dakota Utilities, propane utility.

Landfill. Friday, April 8, 1994 is the last day at the landfill. Mayor Baldwin said there are 3 options: #1. full Sub-Title D landfill, but with Bainville dropped out we can no longer afford this option; #2. go ahead with Damschen and do a complete hydrogeological study with a 75% chance of being granted the exemption and no-migration petition; and #3. shut this landfill down and haul our garbage, then reclaim the old site at a cost of \$20,000 - \$40,000. If we do haul out-of-town, where? Williston charges about \$21.00/ton and is 95 miles round trip. Sidney charges \$35.00/ton and it is 78 miles round trip to the old landfill and 52 miles round trip to the new site which will be open this fall.

Jim asked Lynn if he would haul to Williston at the same cost as the present contract price. Lynn said, "not hardly". Jim said by that then as of April 9th this collection contract is null and void as is the landfill contract. Bottom line for Lynn to haul is \$1.25 - \$1.35 - \$1.40 per mile. Average weight of one load is $3\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ ton.

Montana Magazine

Attorney Hennessy said the contracts are being eliminated by a government with higher power (EPA) action preventing continued dumping at Culbertson landfill, first. Second, Lynn won't perform the contract for the stated consideration.

There was discussion about Lynn hauling Bainville's garbage to Williston. Lynn is hauling Bainville's to Williston for \$1.30/mile.

Mayor Baldwin asked Lynn what his bottom dollar would be if we had him haul our garbage and he said 1.40/mile. The annual tonage figure was estimated at 800 ton and 4 loads a week.

Council decided to hold a public meeting addressing the landfill and garbage issue on Thursday, April 7, 1994 at 7:00 p.m. in inform the community of the options that are available. The council will meet in special session on Friday, April 8, 1994 at 7:00 p.m. to take action on the landfill and garbage issues.

April 7, 1994 Public Meeting 7:00 p.m. Town Hall.

There were 77 people attending.

Six landfill/garbage options were presented by Mayor Baldwin.

Mayor Baldwin asked the person with a video camera to state his name and address for the record and explained that since he is the only video recorder there, that if necessary the tape could be subpoenaed. He said, "Pete Spaabeck, Froid, MT 59226".

Several things have changed since the December public meeting. The consensus at the December public meeting was to operate and maintain a Class II landfill in Culbertson with Froid and Bainville participating. Bainville couldn't go along with us for reason of costs. They have been hauling to Williston since February 1st. When Bainville dropped out the increase per customer went from \$12.00/month to be over \$17.00/month for Froid and Culbertson customers.

Mayor Baldwin explained he had written to the Governor and other officials about the landfill problem and costs, but found no relief.

A handout with a list of options was given to each person attending. Mayor Baldwin explained each option. The option sheet is attached to these minutes.

The people were given the opportunity to discuss and ask questions.

The question was asked if L & L Sanitation will haul our garbage for the current contract price. Mayor Baldwin said why don't you ask Mr. Labatte, here he is. Lynn shook his head in disagreement. Mayor Baldwin said he's shaking his head no, so I'll take that as a no.

Mayor Baldwin said we may have to sit on our garbage for a couple of weeks until we get the garbage and landfill issue resolved. Several people felt the town should made arrangements with L & L Sanitation in the interim to have the garbage picked up and hauled to Sidney or Williston. However, it was noted that Sidney wants a one year agreement.

Mayor Baldwin asked for a straw vote at the conclusion. People were asked to indicate which option they preferred on the handout, with option #7. having the garbage picked up in the interim. The option receiving the most votes was option #4 - Haul to Sidney, household waste only, and operate a Class 3 landfill in Culbertson.

April 8, 1994 7:00 p.m. Special Meeeting. The Culbertson Town Council met in special session with the following present: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gordon Oelkers, Jim Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Lynn Labatte and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Greg Staudinger arrived after the role call. Absent: Gene Dillman. Guests: Gary Rasmussen, Keenan Engelke, Dave Plummer, Stanley Johnson, Dan Heckman, Steve and Shelly Baldwin, Ila Mae Forbregd, Mike Weeks, Bill Casterline, LeRoy Larsen and Linda Labatte.

Thursday, April 7th was the public meeting to inform the people of the changes in the landfill since the December public meeting when the consensus was then to operate and maintain a Class II landfill in Culbertson with Froid and Bainville participating. Since Bainville dropped out and is having their garbage hauled to Williston, the estimated raise in rates went from \$12.00/month to \$17.00/month for Culbertson and Froid. Froid has indicated that if Culbertson got the liner exemption and no-migration petition they would be interested in hauling to the Culbertson landfill, if not, they would have to haul their garbage elsewhere because of the cost increase. Culbertson alone cannot afford a full Subtitle "D" compliance landfill as a residential account monthly rate would be approximately \$32.90.

The straw vote from the public meeting April 7th was option #4 - Haul to Sidney, household waste only, and operate a Class III landfill in Culbertson receiving the most votes. Also many people felt we should have the garbage picked up by L & L Sanitation in the interim.

Mayor Baldwin asked, "Where do we go from there?" L & L Sanitation has repeatedly declined to haul to Williston under the present contract price.

Attorney Hennessy has studied the language in the landfill and collection contracts. In this research, the town dump language refers to the Culbertson landfill as opposed to other landfills.

The EPA regulations being crammed down our throats caused the contracts to be rendered null and void as we won't be able to haul to the Culbertson landfill.

The MCA says the contracts are broken by impossibility of performance and L & L refusing to haul for the old price, except that part of the landfill covering which will drop from 4 times a week to 4 times a year.

Effective midnight tonight, the contracts are made impossible.

Another statute addresses severability of portions of the contracts that can lawfully be carried forward. The only items possible/lawful after midnight for Class III landfill is a small amount of covering and gate time that still needs to be done. Attorney Hennessy asked, "Is there any other price, term or consideration that L & L can quote to the Town's satisfaction than can be modified or substituted?" One consideration is the Class D Certificate that L & L Sanitation holds. The MCA statutory provision for protection of private waste disposal service in municipalities was noted.

One other point is the awkward fact there is only 1+ year left of Lynn's 3 year contract. If the contract were to be re-negotiated, previous contracts will be void. Council would feel more comfortable re-advertising.

Linda Labatte asked if there is a personal conflict. Steve Baldwin's name comes up many times. It was explained that Steve's name comes up only in reference to a past situation concerning the Class D Certificate. Steve stated, "get this our of your head as I am not interested in getting back into the garbage business and you know full well that I can not."

April 8, 1994 special meeting cont.

Lynn handed the council copies of a letter written to him from Katherine M. Irigoin, Attorney. He said here is another opinion concerning the proposed cancellation of contracts.

Bill Casterline said why should Lynn be penalized for the closing of the landfill. Bill couldn't see any way we could legally re-advertise the contract. Bill thinks Lynn could go to court and make the town pay through the duration of his contract. Bill said we should make arrangements with Lynn to haul the garbage for the duration of the contract. Attorney Hennessy said, "you are missing the point; only the lawful parts stand, the unlawful parts don't." Bill said we have a contract for Lynn to pick-up and haul into the Culbertson landfill. This could be simplified if we would sit down and figure and agree on the cost to have Lynn haul the garbage elsewhere.

Lynn said he tried to work with the council, and had an excellent relationship. Only since December that it has been a bad relationship. The bottom line to haul the garbage is \$1.40/mile.

Lynn is willing to take over the Culbertson accounts if the town wants to get out of the garbage business. But if an account doesn't pay, he will cease pick-up. Then the County Sanitarian could end up being involved.

It was noted that the straw vote from the public meeting is not binding.

Bernie W. Finnicum asked Lynn if he could work up a deal where it would cost a set amount for a household and for a business. Right now, Lynn is allowed to haul 500 tons to the Williston landfill with no tax and at \$18.75/ton. If the businesses get more dumpsters and eliminated the Saturday pick-up, it would be close to try to only make 3 trips to the Williston landfill in a week.

There will be a \$2.00 charge included in the garbage charge to each customer for a Class III landfill.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to negotiate a new contract. He then withdrew the motion.

Attorney Hennessy said, "let's be clear about one thing, that these contracts are null and void except to Type III at midnight tonight."

The council still has the opportunity for a novation. This is expecially true where we have a certified carrier.

Sidney would want a one year agreement to dump in their landfill.

Lynn made an offer to bridge the emergency interim so we don't have garbage build up. Lynn asked the council if he could continue through April at contract price plus he would bill us for the dump fee and mileage at \$1.40/mile to where ever he wants to haul it. Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to accept Lynn's emergency interim offer through April for household garbage only. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gordon Oelkers and Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gene Dillman. MOTION CARRIED.

Attorney Hennessy said under contract law rules, we have the opportunity to substitute a new contract. Alternatively, if the council doesn't want to substitute a new contract, then we advertise for bids.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to negotiate with Lynn, and in the mean time, advertise the collection contract for bids to be due for opening at the May 2, 1994 meeting for a turn-key agreement. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Bernie W. Finnicum and Gordon Oelkers. Abstaining: Greg Staudinger. Absent and not voting: Gene Dillman. MOTION CARRIED.

May 2, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum, Greg Staudinger, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Lynn Labatte, Greg Hennessy and Raedelle Aspenlieder. The April 4th, 7th and 8th, 1994 minutes were read and approved. Guests: Roxanne Nickoloff and Dorothy Cody.

Dorothy Cody, candidate for Roosevelt County Commissioner, shared some of her ideas and answered questions.

Swimming Pool. Swimming Pool personnel hired for the 1994 season are as follows: Roxanne Nickoloff - Manager; Jenell Marchwick - Assistant Manager and Lifeguard; and Lifeguards - Jennifer Stuber, Allison Vannatta, Monika Finnicum, Christine Carlisle and Scott Nickoloff. Reserve lifeguards - Rhonda Snyder, KayCee Finnicum, Andrea Vannatta and Michael Schmitz. Swimming instructors will be Jenell Marchwick and Christine Carlisle again this year. Roxanne Nickoloff and Jeri Wolff will do water aerobics again this year. Swimm lessons and aerobics are 75% of fees go to instructors and 25% goes to the town.

Gordon Oelkers made a motion to increase the swimming pool personnel wages 5% above last years wages. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. The 1994 season wages will be \$6.30/hr. - manager; assistant manager and lifeguards \$5.25/hr.

Council agreed that if a couple of the lifeguards wanted to get certified for Water Safety Instruction, the town would pay the class fee.

Garbage Collection Contract. Greg Staudinger made a motion to accept the Garbage Collection Contract effective May 1, 1994 with Lynn J. Labatte, L & L Sanitation. Gene Dillman seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

The period of the contract is May 1, 1994 through June 30, 1995. The consideration is \$6,019.47 per month, \$72,233.60 per year. Payment for April regular and interim garbage hauling: \$6456.27. Payment for April regular (1st - 11th) landfill operations: \$348.33. Payment for buy-out of interim and prospective landfill operations April 12, 1994 through June 30, 1995: \$3,250.00. Lynn will be giving Jim a comparison on commercial garbage generated. Jim will make a rough draft of commercial rates. Ordinance #179 was passed on January 3, 1994. This ordinance amended the garbage rates, raising the rates of all commercial and residential by \$12.00/month. All accounts will be increased by \$12.00 or less. This increase will show up on the May 31, 1994 bills. Those businesses that will increase more than

All accounts will be increased by \$12.00 or less. This increase will show up on the May 31, 1994 bills. Those businesses that will increase more than \$12.00/month will require a new ordinance that will be acted on at the June 6, 1994 meeting. Once the rough draft of rates is done, the committee will meet to review and or adjust the figures.

May 2, 1994 cont.

Landfill. The county road crew worked on Friday, April 29th from 7:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. to dig the garbage out of pit #3 and put in pit #2. Things went well until they got to a 20' wide x 140' long area that was too wet to haul out. They will let this set for a couple days to dry out. County may go back in the end of this week. Lynn said the city crawler could probably move the wet area without sinking. As soon as pit #3 is cleaned out the the State gives the okay, we can open the landfill for Type III. Council discussed opening the landfill on Saturdays only, from 10:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. in the summer and possibly 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. in the winter. Council will offer the landfill job to Dave Sweet at \$5.00/hr.

There was some discussion on dump fees at the landfill. More information on this to come at the June meeting.

 $\underline{\text{M.D.U.}}$ Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to accept the franchise agreement with Montana-Dakota Utilities, Propane Utility for 1% of gross sales for 25 years. Greg Staudinger seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Greg Staudinger made a motion to adopt Resolution #278. A Resolution indicating the Town of Culbertson's intention to be an active member of the Great Northern Economic Development District.

Sheriff Conract. Jim will talk to the Mayors of Froid and Bainville about the sheriff contract for the east end.

Paul Finnicum requested water only at the trailer court he recently purchased. He wants to run his horses in the area so they will eat up the grass to clean the place up. The precedent has been when the water is on, sewer and garbage charges are on as well. The council didn't feel they could make an exception.

Montana Bar. Bob Linthicum requested permission to rope off the south block of main street on Saturday night, June 4th for a street dance. He said they would police the area and clean it up as they have in the past. He can contact Doug prior to this date for baracades. Council approved.

The Lions Club and Women's Club want to plant the old Nay lot that the school now owns to grass and install a sprinkler system. Dick Iverson asked if a back-flow prevention valve is required - no, only on new service installations and would the town supply the water - council said no.

June 6, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gene Dillman, Greg Staudinger, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Doug Finnicum, Lynn Labatte and Raedelle Aspenlieder. The May 2, 1994 minutes were read and approved.

M & M's Place Garbage. Melvin Torgerson, M & M's Place had a question on the comercial garbage rate. He wondered if, when his place was evaluated, Lynn realized he was being billed for residential and commercial garbage. Lynn did not realize this. Melvin said he also gets extra garbage pick-up on Saturdays, which costs him extra with L & L Sanitation. Commercial accounts get 2 garbage pick-ups a week, any extra pick-ups are their option. With more holding capacity, the Saturday pick-up could be eliminated. However, Lynn said if he is not

picked up on Saturday that the unit count should be bumped up. No changes were made to M & M's Place garbage charge.

Paul Finnicum purchased Bell Trailer Court. He is in the process of selling $1\frac{1}{2}$ lots. The question was asked if as the lots sell if there would be a new hook-up charged for each. Greg Staudinger made a motion that there will not be a new hook-up charge, as the trailer court has paid the construction fee assessment. Any extra costs to hook the individual meter are the responsibility of the property owner. This will be an additional construction fee assessment. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Great Northern Development Corporation. Gordon Oelkers made a motion that as a member of the Great Northern Development Corporation we contribute \$1.00 per capita, \$896.00 and that Mayor Baldwin represent Culbertson. Greg Staudinger seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

State Highway Shop. Lee Vannatta, Montana State Highway Maintenance Shop, questioned the garbage charge for the shop. He said they have only been getting one pick-up per week and wondered if they could get a seasonal rate as they have more garbage in the summer. Council noted that this account has not been charged for garbage service ever. Lynn indicated the state shop has always had only one pick-up per week. Council agreed that with the new rate schedule, as a commercial account the stat shop shall receive 2 pick-ups a week and the rate would be left as assessed.

Building Permits. Building permits for Zane Grimsrud and Jeff Aspenlieder were approved and signed.

Parks. The town received a \$150.00 donation to parks from an anonymous donor. Clerk will put a thank-you in the Searchlight.

Sheriff Contract. Greg Staudinger made a motion to execute the Agreement for General Law Enforcement Services for the Towns of Culbertson, Froid and Bainville with further amendments as discussed. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Dean Harmon had stopped in prior to the meeting and discussed the water reservation application the town had filed and the objection to the MT Fish, Wildlife & Parks application for water reservation. The law firm of Ted Doney apparently needed a letter from the town explaining what we want to do about the defense of our application. It appeared Candice Torgerson, Attorney in the Doney Law Firm was handling the defense of applications from Wolf Point & Scobey. There was some confusion on this so Attorney Hennessy suggested Raedelle contact Doney and Torgerson and ask them to send him a letter explaining what it is they want from us.

Mosquito Fogger. Council reviewed information on a mosquito fogger that mists without the addition of diesel fuel and kill time is about 15 minutes. Doug will check with Darrel Dilger in Wolf point about a possible used fogger. Council will keep this in mind for FY 1994-95 budget.

Swimming Pool. Council approved of Roxanne and Jenell attending a Pool Workshop in Wolf Point on Friday, June 17, 1994. Town will pay mileage to one driver.

GJV. General journal voucher #101 was approved.

The Town received a letter from the Biking Vikings - a voluntary organization working to further sport and physical activity among the handicapped. The Biking Vikings wanted the Mayor to arrange a free overnight stay and simple meals for the 10 participants. Council suggested clerk contact the Women's Club. Overnight stay could possibly be the park, Trinity Lutheran or the Guard Shop. If the Women's Club is not interested, then put a notice in the paper. It was also mentioned we might let them know to take the Fort Kipp bottom route instead of on highway 16.

Garbage Rates. Greg Staudinger made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 182, an Ordinance declaring an emergency and amending Town Code Section 7.02.070 to re-establish equitable garbage rates for the Town of Culbertson, Montana. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Solid Waste Landfill Fees. Greg Staudinger made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 183, an Ordinance amending Town Code Section 7.02.071 Solid Waste Landfill Fees. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Landfill. Saturday, June 4th landfill pit #3 was cleaned out with the assistance of the county. Jim will call Barry Damschen to discuss a closure plan for the landfill. Jimm will call the State Solid Waste Bureau to see if we can have an exception to open and haul tree branches to the landfill prior to an inspection. This is necessary due to the recent storm. If we get the okay the landfill will be open Saturday, June 11th for tree branches. Jim and Greg will compose a list of what can and can't be disposed of in the Class III Landfill and the days and hours open. Copies will be handed out at the landfill and an ad put in the Searchlight.

Council discussed the idea of tickets for non-Culbertson residents. The landfill gate person will be allowed to take checks only, no cash. The rates to be \$10.00 for a pick-up load and \$25.00 for a farm truck load. The ticket books will have stubs, and tickets can be purchased at the town office, Finnicum's or Oelkers Servicenter.

Council decided to pay the gate attendant \$6.00/hour and put them on the payroll. In the winter we will make arrangements for an electric heater. Rich Bryant was interested. Tracie Finnicum possibly will fill-in in Rich's absence.

The Boy Scouts will help with the clean-up at the landfill. Council decided to donate \$100.00 to the scout program, plus buy the boys pizza and pop at noon. Clerk will buy garbage bags from 4-H.

Council decided to sell the 1972 Bell Trailer to Rich Bryant for \$400.00.

<u>Street Signs</u>. Council discussed the no U turn signs and the negative affect of the unfriendly signs. No action was taken.

Clerk was asked to call County Sanitarian Ron Smith about rats at Bill Owens

It will take about an hour to cross the road. I'll put up traffic barriers and reroute traffic through my field etc: I realize the road must be put back in



September 7, 1994. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Gene Dillman, Bernie W. Finnicum, Greg Staudinger, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Lynn Labatte, Doug Finnicum and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Guests: Glen Larsen, Rich Walker and Alvin Lien. The August 1, 1994 minutes were approved.

Roosevelt County Fair Board. Glen Larsen, member of the Roosevelt County Fair Board, attended to protest the water bill at the Roosevelt County Fairgrounds. The 7-15-94 meter reading showed usage of 239,000 gallons, resulting in a water charge of \$405.53. Glen didn't think they could possibly use this amount of water. Gordon Oelkers recalled the water in the girls restroom being left wide open but did not know for how long. Also, Doug said the pit was completely full of water. The grass was also being watered off of this line, as the hydrant is hooked to the building meter. Attorney Hennessy suggested the Fair Board file a claim for vandalism with their insurance due to the water running in the girls restroom.

Diamond Coulee Trailer Court. Rich Walker complained about the Diamond Coulee Trailer Court being charged for one unit. He claims there has been no usage or services that he should have to pay for. However, the curb stop is on. He does have occassional campers stop for the night. The bottom line was if he wants the curb stop left on, then the water, sewer, garbage and construction fees will be charged. If he wants the water service off, then he will be charged the construction fee \$15.40 monthly.

Sewer Main Line Easement. Tri-County Sanitarian, Ron Smith, could not come up with a State Statute or ruling against allowing a structure to be moved on or built over a sewer main line. Doug suggested that Ray Oelkers dig up around the sewer main and slip a culvert around it. Then, if the sewer main had to be dug up, it would be a matter of sliding the new main through the culvert. Ray did not appear to be interested in this, as it would be an investment on a gamble of whether or not it would ever by necessary. The Indemnity Agreement for Lots 5 and 6, Block 15 of the Original Townsite of the Town of Culbertson was signed by both property owner Ray Oelkers and Mayor James E. Baldwin. The Indemnity Agreement will be filed with the Clerk and Recorder, Roosevelt County. A copy is also attached to these minutes. With the signing of the agreement, the building permit was also signed and approved.

Alvin Lien asked if it was permissable to build a garage over his sewer service line. Council said we have no regulations against it.

<u>Cemetery</u>. Jim talked to Lewis Gobbs about expanding the cemetery to the south. Gobbs appeared to be interested in letting the cemetery expand. However, the survey is platted incorrectly. The time to fix the error is at the time we purchase additional land. This may require another survey.

Garbage. Lynn said most all trees have been trimmed. Rea Miller's needs to be done yet.

Bruce Waldhausen Waterline. Council reviewed the Waterline Easement granted by Lewis and Howard Gobbs unto Bruce and Judy Waldhausen. Bruce and Judy Waldhausen will be tapping into the town water main in Spetember 1994.

Nemont Right Of Way Easement. Council reviewed the Right Of Way Easement from Nemont for Bruegger-Centennial Park. Council wants a drawing and the easement needs to be more specific and indicate west of baracade.

Coputer Hardware Service Agreement. Service Maintenance Agreement price quotes for the office computer were: IBM \$337.00 for 1 yr.; and Gaffaney's \$400.00 for 1 yr. Town will continue the Service Maintenance Agreement with IBM.

MOTION TO RECONSIDER OCTOBER 3, 1994 APPROVAL OF BUILDING PERMIT THAT AUTHORIZED "ME TOO" PIZZA AND VIDEO TO MOVE ITS PLACE OF BUSINESS TO THE CORNER OF HIGHWAY 16 AND HIGHWAY 2

I, Gene Dillman, move the Culbertson City Council to reconsider the October 3, 1994, approval of the building permit authorizing "Me Too" Pizza & Video to change its place of business to the corner of Highway 16 and Highway 2. I made a mistake in signing my name approving the permit on October 3, 1994, and I desire the City Council of Culbertson to consider this and to deny the building permit. The following reasons are set forth as the basis for this motion:

- 1. I have now heard that "Me Too" Pizza & Video will be applying for an alcohol beverage license for the premises located at the corner of Highway 16 and Highway 2.
- 2. I was unaware that an alcohol beverage license would be applied for and that alcohol would be sold or consumed at that location.
- 3. The property is also located in a flood zone that requires additional compliance and approval from our council.
- 4. Additional requirements within the Culbertson City Code require compliance and approval by the City Council to address both flood plain concerns and alcohol sales and consumption concerns.
- 5. I will be objecting and opposing to any approval regarding this business in the flood plain and any request from the City Council regarding alcohol consumption and/or sales at this location.
- 6. I have contacted many of my constituents regarding having "Me Too" Pizza & Video locate at the corner of Highway 16 and Highway 2.

Me Too Pizza Building Permit. Laurie Averill gave the council a copy of the Elevation Certificate filled out by Interstate Engineering, Inc. Laurie will mail this to the Federal Emergency Management Agency. FEMA will either accept or deny. If FEMA takes them out of the floodplain, they would not have to comply with the town floodplain ordinance.

The December 5, 1994 minutes were approved.

USDA Office Consolidation. Carol Ritter, Acting Supervisor of Farm Service Agency (FSA, formerly ASCS/FCIC) explained the questionnaire/survey will be sent to active producers (operators & owners) of FSA, NRCS (Natural Resources Conservation Service, formerly SCS) and borrows of RECDS (Rural Economic and Community Development Service, formerly FmHA/REA). In Roosevelt County there are approximately 1200 active producers serviced by FSA.

The Montana Agricultural Statistics Service will be conducting the survey. According to Ritter, the surveys will be a democratic vote. The surveys will go out approximately January 20, 1995 and be due back on January 30, 1995. Possibly in mid-February the results of the survey will be available. Special attention needs to be paid, as this survey will come from the Montana Agricultural Statistics Service and the time limit given to return the survey.

Garbage. Lynn reported everything is okay where the garbage is concerned.

Montana Dept. of Transportation. The Montana Dept. of Transportation sent plans to install a valley gutter on main on U.S. Highway 16 through town. Greg Staudinger made a motion to sign the Memorandum of Understanding, Construction Agreement and the set of plans referencing the valley gutter. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Coach</u>. Since the close of Chile Peppers and the Coach not preparing food anymore, the amount of garbage generated is less. Therefore, the council agreed to drop the garbage charge by 1 unit.

There was discussion about having a form for disposal of tires. This form will be worked up. There was discussion in regard to Ordinance No. 183. The consensus of the council was the fee for tire disposal is a seperate charge from the landfill fee of \$25.00 a truck load or \$10.00/pick-up load.

GJV's. General journal vouchers #120 & 121 were approved and signed.

Health Insurance. Steve's health insurance premium for family coverage is \$265.00/month. In order that he will net \$265.00 the gross payroll for health insurance benefit would have to be \$359.00. The health insurance benefit will not change the hourly pay rate or the overtime pay rate, it is a seperate benefit. Greg Staudinger made a motion to give Steve and Raedelle \$359.00/month for health insurance benefit effective Feb. 1, 1995. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion.
